Energy Footprint Tool now OPEN

This is now open for churches to enter your 2021 energy data. It's **so** important to gather this information, so we can each track our carbon emissions year-on-year, as well as monitor the wider trends across the Diocese. This year there's a **hard deadline of 31**st **July** to allow us to analyse the data, and reopen the tool on 1st Jan 2023. Check out this new guidance to help you complete the tool.



New Eco Church awards for our churches

Congratulations to Holy Trinity Westbury-on-Trym who has been awarded an Silver Eco Church award this month, and to Redland Parish Church and St Mary's Marshfield who both received Bronze awards – bringing the total number of awards across the Diocese to 30. 
Wild churches – seed blessings for the Big Harvest

Grant for thermal imaging in churches

The Diocese of Bristol has been awarded a grant from the National Church to purchase two sets of thermal imagining cameras and moisture metes for use in church visits. In April the DAC will receive training in thermography, following which the devices will be available for use in churches. Will your church divest from fossil fuels?

Since Bristol and Oxford Dioceses became the first to divest from fossil fuels in April last year, others have followed and now seven CofE dioceses have taken this prophetic step. Individual churches are encouraged to do likewise, and commit to switching your bank account and/or savings and investments to green alternatives.

Churches Count on Nature week: 4th - 12th June

This June sees the return of <u>Churches Count on Nature</u>, a week where churches are encouraged to undertake wildlife surveys of your churchyards which are then collated on the <u>National Biodiversity Network (NBN)</u>, a nationwide database of wildlife in the UK.
