Churches have until next Thursday to enter energy data into the [Parish Returns system](#), for your church's – and the wider diocese's – carbon footprint to be calculated. Please dig out your church's 2020 energy bills and log on asap.




Climate Sunday: Church of England service


COP26 Coalition: Mass mobilisation on Sat 6 Nov

Subsidised Church Energy Audits reopen: Save £200

An Energy Audit helps your church to see where you can make energy savings and reduce your carbon footprint. Dozens of churches across the diocese have already received these audits in the last round. There are 100 available now – so be quick! Qualifying churches will receive a subsidy of £200, making the price £245 + VAT. [Details here](#).
