Harvest Festival Food Drive 12–25 September 2016

Building on last year's successful food-drive we will once again be collecting food donations for the Foodbank at Holy Trinity Church, Bridge Community Café, Wester Hailes.

Currie Kirk collects food donations throughout the year but we will have a special Harvest Thanksgiving collection of non-perishable foods during the weeks of 12—25 September. We hope that this year some of the local schools and other community organisations might donate food with us. You can drop items off at the Gibson Craig Hall office between 9.30 am and 11.45 am Tuesday to Friday or else bring them to the Gibson Craig on Saturday 24 September at 3 pm for our *Pop-up Family Praise service* or the Sunday 25 September's *Harvest Festival Service* at 10 am in the Kirk.



Angie Thomson, the Foodbank's Manager came to speak to Currie Kirk last year to tell us about the foodbank. She explains, "Foodbank clients in need of a food parcel come to the Bridge Community Cafe on Tuesday afternoons. Clients are welcomed with coffee/tea and cake whilst they have their details registered and receive their food parcels. We have trained volunteers who come in and chat to the people who arrive, often stressed and with many issues in their lives which contribute to their need for help with food. Sometimes people just want to come in for a coffee and a chat. Our Foodbank is a short term support facility to help people as they pick themselves up from a wide range of difficult circumstances, often involving loss of income or short term loss of benefits."



Link to Hope—Family and Elderly Shoebox Appeal

nce again Currie Kirk, *via* the Mission & Outreach Committee is linking up with the charity, "Link to Hope" Organisation who last year supplied over 39,000 Family and Elderly shoe boxes to refugee families in distress in Eastern Europe just in time for Christmas. In 2015 Link to Hope were able to deliver shoeboxes to Moldova and then cross over to Odessa in Ukraine where they met refugees living in particularly difficult circumstances. Many had fled the war zone in Eastern Ukraine. At Christmas time, these basic shoeboxes are filled with many goodies and necessities from chocolates and small toys, to candles and shampoos, to handkerchiefs and toothpaste, and covered with Christmas paper to transform them into a colourful gift that brings much needed help and joy to families and elderly people in great stress and trauma.

During the months of September and October Currie Kirk will be handing out leaflets which contain all the necessary information to fill a standard shoebox with some of the items mentioned above. The average cost of filling a box is £10 but please feel free to hand in items that will go a long way to filling up a shoebox. Items are outlined in the leaflet. Boxes can be handed in to the church office at the Gibson-Craig Halls, 156 Lanark Road West, during its working hours.

The closing date is 4 November for collection. Currie Kirk has always provided generously to this great cause. Please help to make this year one to remember for those children and families in need in Eastern Europe.
