he Big Sing which was attended by some of our Guild members and was held on Wednesday 23 May was a great evening of song. It was lovely to hear the total result from all the Projects which the Guilds have sponsored during the last three years 2015-2018: Ascension Trust; Care for the Family; Christian Aid; Feed the Minds; Mission International; and Prospects in Scotland—The total figure was £725,091.50. The Guild has now chosen six new projects which it will support for the next three years. The Guild's new theme will be 'One journey many roads'. Our Guild has chosen to support the "Seema Project" in India which was started to protect those who are vulnerable to being trafficked, often children whose mothers are prostitutes. In 2016 the charity built a home for 32 children and the Guild partnership will allow them to double the size. The Guild is also, once again, supporting Edinburgh Direct Aid—more in next month's Kirk News.

Every 100 metres or so volunteer stewards from Christian Aid were stationed to ensure our well being, and the 300 or so walkers were well supervised while on the bridge. On arrival at the north end Christian Aid supplied us with soft drinks and some delicate little confections, courtesy of Mr Tunnock of Uddingston. It was worth the effort!

Cards stamped by the supervisors, we started our walk on the return journey becoming quite friendly and on nodding terms with other walkers as in turn we overtook and in turn were overtaken. What a splendid way to make friends and also to make money for Christian Aid!

On arrival at the south end of the bridge, we had our cards checked and stamped by officials and were presented with our medals! We, a weary band of wandering walkers wended our way to a 'watering hole' in South Queensferry for a welcome refreshment.

#### ANNUAL ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31<sup>ST</sup> DECEMBER 2017 AND BUDGET FOR 2018

The following pages show the General Fund income and expenditure of Currie Kirk for the past year and the budget for the current year.

Before commenting on the Accounts and Budget I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their continued financial support.

#### Accounts 2017

#### Income

The overall income in 2017 was £33609 (15.4%) lower than in 2016.

The key factors to this were that:

- No legacies were received in 2017 (a legacy of £31476 was received in 2016) and
- Donation income has reduced by £3744 (3%) in 2017. Regular giving shows a 5% reduction from 2016, with the shortfall being reduced to 3% through increases in the Open Plate, One-off donations and a small increase in Gift Aid Tax Refunds.

The income from other charitable activities (ie-Weddings, Funerals, Hall Lets etc.) show an overall level in 2017 consistent with 2016.

#### Expenditure

The overall expenditure in 2017 shows a similar level to 2016. This is mostly due to unplanned underspends in comparison to the 2017 budget, which can be attributed to:

- less Salaries with the Youth & Families Worker not employed until mid-August and the Gibson Craig Halls
   Caretaker not being replaced in 2017 after retiring in June.
- less Fabric general maintenance through the General Fund specifically for the church.
- Committee budget allocations not being fully used.
- Lower Presbytery Dues a change of charging period made 2017 only an eight month charge.
- New heating controls in the Gibson Craig Halls helped to save approximately £1000.

Most other ongoing expenditure funded through the General Fund has been reasonably controlled near to the budgeted estimates.

The outcome of the above leaves a balance in the General Fund of £34841, with all creditors accounted for.

#### **Budget 2018**

The budget for 2018 forecasts a 6% reduction in donation income from the 2017 actual income in line with the consistent decline in regular donors as in previous years.

The budgeted expenditure for 2018 forecasts a 15.5% increase as a result of higher Salary costs (Youth & Families Worker), some extra ongoing Fabric maintenance and a significant Mission allocation to the Year of the Young Person Project.

The above means that in 2018 it is more likely to end with a significant shortfall.

It is hoped that the budgeted income will be exceeded and that the actual expenditure may work out at a lower level that forecast to minimise the effect this will have in reducing the financial reserves.

### Data Protection and Privacy Update—General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

he General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) is a new law that replaced the Data Protection Act 1998 and became effective in the UK from 25 May 2018. The GDPR strengthens the rules around Personal Data and requires organisations to be more accountable and transparent. It also gives people greater control over their own personal date.

In order to comply with the new law we are updating the "Data Protection" sections of the Currie Kirk website. This will include our Data Protection Policy, Privacy Notice and Data Retention Policy. In making these changes we are following guidance only recently issued by the Church of Scotland Law Department. Kirk Session will be reviewing these documents at its next meeting in August and I will intimate any changes after that.

As a result of GDPR, many of you will have had requests from companies and organisations for your consent for the continued use of your personal information. I'm glad to say that Currie Kirk does not need to do this except in the case of office bearers or other contacts whose personal details are disclosed to third parties, for example, by appearing in the Kirk News or the website. For these, consent will be requested by the Kirk News Editor or the Kirk Secretary.
