A Christmas Message from the Interim Moderator



Dear Friends,

Christmas is approaching rapidly—too rapidly for many of us as we scurry around to get everything done. Children tend to look forward to Christmas, they have great expectations—and not just material expectations of presents, they also have great expectations that Christmas will be exciting and good fun. As adults our expectations are much more mixed. Christmas and New Year are often a poignant reminder of what we have lost and of people who are no longer with us. Christmas and New Year are times when we think about the successes and the failures of our lives. Christmas and New Year are times when we look at our world and are sometimes despairing.

Yet with Christmas comes the reminder that God loves us enough to enter this human life of ours, that God loves us enough to share in our experiences. At Christmas we are struck again by the wonder of the Incarnation and the knowledge that no matter our hopes and expectations, no matter our failures, losses or despair, God's love surrounds us, God's love is always there.

One of the most moving and most powerful passages in the whole Bible is John 1 vv 1—16 because here, devoid of detail about shepherds and angels, wise men and stars is the stark truth of the Incarnation. Here we have laid out for us the ultimate self-giving of God. This is a passage to live with day by day, to go back to time and time again—a passage, not just for Christmas, but a reading, to sit with, to pray with, to wonder at. Ask yourself, 'what does this passage mean for the way I live my life every day in what is left of 2023 but also in 2024 and beyond.'

Fresh Start was established to help those moving on from homelessness to make a home for themselves. At Currie Kirk we give our support by donating a variety of items which we no longer need or by giving cash donations to help with the work Fresh Start does. To those of you who are not familiar with the Charity here are some of their activities.

- * Provide starter packs of basis household goods to those getting their first home;
- * Arrange volunteers to decorate two rooms in people's homes;
- * Fund raise for white goods eg Cookers for Christmas yearly appeal;
- * Provide a Community hub providing, food, cooking classes and support;
- * Growing spaces across the city, the produce being used in their cooking classes; and
- * Their new initiative is NESSie a collaboration of several North Edinburgh Support Groups to work in a person centred way, tailored to the needs of the individual.

These are just a few of the support services provided by the staff and volunteers at Fresh Start. We appreciate the good work done by these volunteers including our very own, Elizabeth Wood and Jean Smith, two long serving volunteers who help at the Fresh Start premises.

- * Bedding, not duvets or pillows,
- * Towels and tea towels, cleaning items, cutlery, cooking utensils, pots and pans in good condition,

- * Small electrical items but no bric-a-brac please.

Whether it's peace, or needless war.


Lets fight to save the sick and old
