They will be happy to discuss with you our policies and procedures for ensuring the safety of our young people and children. Any concerns regarding the welfare and safety of any child or young person whilst in the church's care must be reported as soon as possible to one of the above.

Safeguarding Vulnerable Adults

Melissa Green or Fr Adam will be happy to discuss with you our policies and procedures for ensuring the safety of vulnerable adults. Any concerns that arise during visiting, pastoral ministry or prayer ministry must be reported as soon as possible to one of the above.

Under no circumstances should a church worker or volunteer or member of the public carry out their own investigations into the allegation or suspicion of abuse. Training sessions are held regularly to ensure all workers with our children, young people and vulnerable adults are familiar with the procedures and understand the importance of working to best practice at all times.
