Revd Lynn writes

Today whilst in the supermarket, I saw a sign for 'Pancake Day'. It happens each year – nowhere do we read its rightful name: 'Shrove Tuesday' because if we did, no one would have any idea what it means! It is another Christian tradition which has become thoroughly secularised. Of course, within the church we remember it as the day when Christians traditionally attended church to confess and be absolved of their sins before entering into the penitential season of Lent on Ash Wednesday.

And here lies another day which goes without notice, sadly, both outside and within the church. Ash Wednesday is a day of obligation for Christians – a day when we are called into church to mark the beginning of Lent. On Ash Wednesday we are invited to face the need for penitence, if Lent is to be a true time of spiritual growth and discipline.

Each year we pause on Ash Wednesday to reflect upon how we will spend the weeks of preparation leading us to Holy Week and Easter. Traditionally it is a time for self-denial and self-examination, but it is also a great opportunity for us to really reflect upon the person of Jesus of Nazareth. Who was he? What did He come to teach us? Why did He die for us?

Jesus Christ, the Son of God ~ fully human and yet fully divine, was subject, just as we are, to temptation and experienced the vast array of human emotions; He knew joy and happiness and laughter and the love of family and friends; He also knew anger, frustration and hurt. He knew fear, anguish and loneliness, He knew humiliation and mockery. He knew what it was to feel totally alone, and He knew how it felt to be robbed of all dignity.

And in Gethsemene, and on the cross, He knew desperation. He experienced life in all its dimensions because Jesus Christ came to share fully in our humanity and it is because of this we can be assured that whatever we have to go through in life, however difficult or daunting it might seem,

He has already been there, and He will be there alongside us, walking with us and when we need it, holding on to us tightly.

As we move through Lent we are drawn closer to the foot of the cross where we will witness the very worst the world has to offer ~ hatred, pride, fear, jealousy, greed, cowardice and envy; but where we are also brought face to face with the overwhelming love, grace, mercy and forgiveness of our suffering Lord. The love, grace and mercy of our God on the cross has the power to defeat all the evil of this temporal existence. We only have to trust in it.

And so, as we move through Lent and we try to give up the little luxuries and avoid temptation, let us also be realistic in accepting that we are merely human. This doesn't mean we shouldn't accept responsibility for our weaknesses, our mistakes and our failures. It means we should accept them, and having accepted them we should bring them to the foot of the cross in real penitence and faith, asking for God's forgiveness; forgiveness for times when we have doubted Him, forgiveness when pride has obstructed our judgement, forgiveness for the times when we have failed to be as caring and compassionate as Jesus taught us to be, forgiveness for the times we have failed to trust in Him, forgiveness for the times we have just really got our priorities in life all wrong.

Let each of us use the forthcoming Lenten period to reflect upon Jesus and upon our discipleship as we prepare to stand before Him, just as we are, at the foot of the cross.

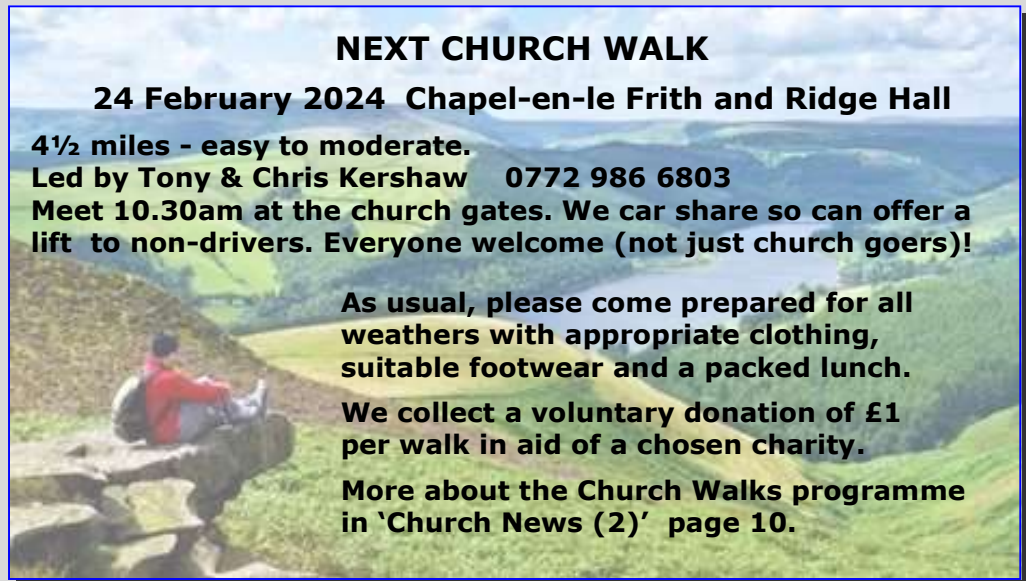

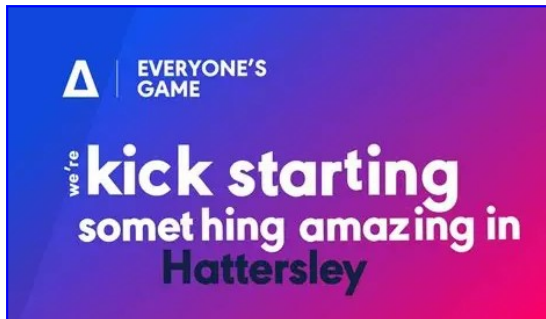

High Days and Holy Days

29 February - St. Oswald of Worcester: The saint for Leap Year

There is a saint for Leap Year: He is St Oswald of Worcester, who died on 29th February 992. His family story was extraordinary, and full of some surprising 'leaps' itself. It provides a tantalising glimpse of what happened to at least one of those pagan Viking warriors who settled in Anglo-Saxon Britain.

Oswald's great-uncle had come to England c 865, as part of the 'Great Heathen Army' of Viking invaders. But his son, Oswald's uncle, Oda, forsook paganism, and not only converted to Christianity, but actually ended up as Archbishop of Canterbury. From there, Oda was in a position to help his nephew Oswald, another Christian convert.

Oda sent young Oswald to be educated at Fleury Abbey, the great Benedictine monastery and centre of learning in France. There Oswald absorbed the Benedictine ideals which guided his later life and work.

Back in England, he became bishop of Worcester in 961, and with the support of King Edgar, eagerly joined in major reforms of the Anglo-Saxon church. In 972 Oswald was made Archbishop of York, and did much to renew the church in the Danelaw. He founded Ramsey Abbey, which became one of the great Fenland monasteries.

Oswald was a popular archbishop. It was his daily custom in Lent to wash the feet of the poor. On 29th February 992 he had just completed this service at Worcester when he collapsed and died. In later years, Worcester adopted him and Wulfstan as its two chief saints.

The Nduli Health Centre build is so big and beautiful!!



Please pray for the Health Centre to be completed. As with any venture of faith, we have met a few barriers recently that we need to overcome, as God shows us the way ahead. We can do nothing without God's presence in the vision.



Nduli Health Centre is being built with a lot of sacrificial love and voluntary giving of time, skills, energy and money. The team above is amazing: Stanley (treasurer), Swai (engineer), Daniel (headmaster) and Pastor Zeph. A year ago, what you see in the photo (left) was just a field!! There are still all the electrics, plumbing, windows, finishing and equipping to do: but people are moving into the area as the Health Centre is being built!



Meanwhile in Dodoma:

The Tazama na Tunza Dispensary team is doing so well, 5 years on. Laura did a financial audit which shows that as well as being able to offer trustworthy care to the poorest in the community: the health centre is breaking even financially: This is a miracle in a time when the cost of living in Tanzania has doubled and for those with Health Insurance, the Government have not paid any health service like us for, 6 months+ Teresia, shown here with a patient, is our new scanner and is wise and experienced. The team is developing, sharing God's love.



Here is Pastor Zeph with a pupil, Elisha, at the Church School in Dodoma. Elisha is an orphan, and has inherited HIV. He is cared for by the Church, attends Wisdom School, and his health is cared for by the Tazama na Tunza Health Centre. So Jesus has his arms round Elisha, and many others too.

News from Ukraine ... and Russia

From the Bible Trust

For more than 600 days, colleagues in Ukraine have been taking aid, medicine and the Bible to people across the whole country.



Gen. Secretary Anatoliy Raychynets has returned from visiting troops on the front line outside Bakhmut. He met soldiers who were manning a cannon, but also reading Psalm 91.

'We were interrupted by shell explosions,' said Anatoliy. 'When I found myself in a trench next to a soldier called Kyrylo, he told me that two weeks ago we had come and given him a Bible.'

Kyrylo told him: 'I have never been to church, never read the Bible, because I never had one. Here, at the combat positions, in short moments of silence, I started reading prayers from the Book of Psalms, as you advised me back then.'

'I feel warmth inside me while reading. I have never experienced anything like this in my life. I realised that it was God who came to me, a sinner, at the age of 57. He came here, to the swamp, to the horrors of the war, to find me. Thank you for the Bible. It revived me to a new life, a life with God.'

More than 11,000 Russian Orthodox Christians have signed an open letter urging Patriarch Kirill to reinstate a much-loved priest in the capital, the Revd Alexei Uminsky, who refused to recite an official prayer for their country's victory over Ukraine. Instead, he prayed for peace.

More than 300 Russian Orthodox priests have signed an appeal against the Ukraine invasion. Most of them have since been silenced or forced to emigrate. Some have joined a new clergy association, Christians for Peace, whose website, christians4peace.com is blocked in Russia.

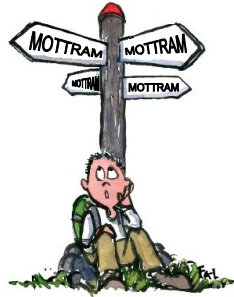
The Union of Orthodox Journalists commented -

"To ban a priest from ministry simply for refusing to read a prayer that contradicts his ethical views clearly has nothing to do with the Kingdom of Heaven and brings enormous harm to the Church."

A NOTICE FROM WILLOW WOOD

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING RAISES TREE-RIFIC HOSPICE FUNDS

Willow Wood's Christmas tree recycling service has raised a tree-mendous amount towards supporting patient care at the Hospice.



The convenient recycling initiative allowed residents in Tameside and Glossop to register their trees online to be collected and responsibly disposed of in the new year, whilst making a donation of their choice to the Hospice.

498 real trees were collected and £7,175 was raised, which will make a difference to patients from our communities with life-limiting illnesses.

In Tameside, trees were chipped by Tameside Council's Greenspace team, who will re-use them in local parks.

In Glossop, the trees were collected by Amazon and A&D Distribution and taken to Hartleys Garden Centre. They will be chipped by Bankswood Treecare and used by the Pony Patch to lay a new path for the ponies.

Samantha Kitch, Fundraising Manager at Willow Wood Hospice, said: "On behalf of us all at the Hospice, a sincere thank you to all of our brilliant partners for facilitating the collection and recycling of the trees, and to everyone who registered their trees and donated to Willow Wood. "We would also like to thank all those who helped to spread the word and raise awareness of the tree recycling service.

"With only 20 per cent of our funding coming from central government, the support we receive from our local communities is absolutely vital."

Tameside Council Executive Member responsible for environmental services, Cllr Denise Ward, said: "This is a fantastic result and has been a great opportunity for people to do something positive for the environment while also supporting a charity that is important to so many local people and that does a lot of positive, valued work in our community.

A letter from Catherine Rogerson

Dear All

As you probably know, Carl and I have had a dramatic few weeks. I was rushed into hospital with sepsis and have no recollection of the first few days. I was well cared for by the consultant and the staff and can only offer them a gold star each. When I came home, it was hard to get up and down stairs and I needed Carl's assistance.

I had been home about three days when we received a telephone call from the Registrar at Tameside Hospital saying that Carl's blood tests showed potentially fatal results and he had to go to hospital immediately. As I could not drive, they sent a taxi to collect him. However, we are both now doing well and starting to get about.

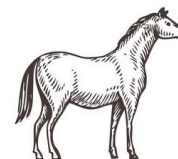

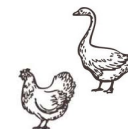

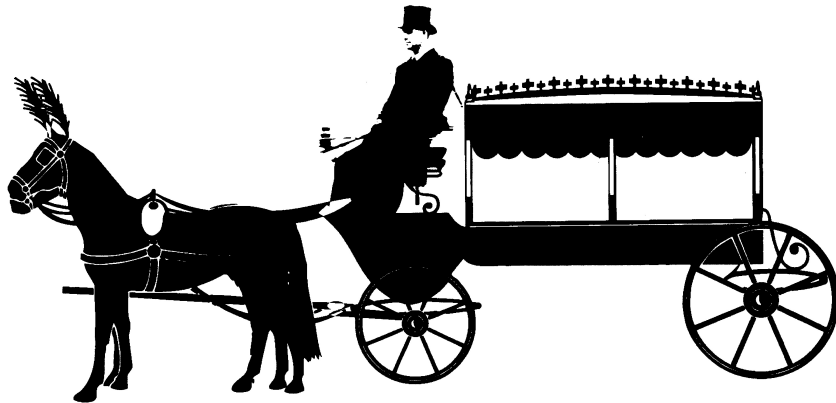
