

A MESSAGE FROM THE ARCHBISHOPS OF CANTERBURY AND YORK

PRAY . . . and take part.

This was the Archbishops' injunction after the Prime Minister announced that the country would go to the polls on 4 July.

On Wednesday afternoon, just minutes after Rishi Sunak announced the General Election, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York released a statement inviting people to pray for the nation, and to "think about how we all can play our part both as voters and, more broadly, as citizens".

"It is a time for us all — people of all faiths and of none — to ask important questions about what kind of country we want to be," they said.

"We are facing epic challenges both in our country and our world: from questions of war and peace, to poverty and injustice and very future of the Earth God has given us.

"Faced with such huge questions, our instinct as Christians is to turn to God in prayer and so we want to put prayer at the very heart of this campaign."

In a pre-recorded video, Archbishop Cottrell said he hoped that people would vote, and that Christians would place their vote "based on what's going to be best for God's world".

Church House will be releasing prayer materials during the campaign, under the banner #PrayYourPart.

The statement from the Archbishops included a plea for the runup to the election to be "marked by respect for one another, for good grace and a commitment to truth and integrity".

The Archbishop of Wales, the Most Revd Andrew John, echoed their call for civility, and urged "everyone to make full use of our democratic freedoms and to take part in the debates and the decisions which are before us".

ALL CREATURES GREAT AND SMALL

In June, a week-long event will celebrate wildlife in churchyards and cemeteries, which have provided wildlife havens for centuries.

During Love Your Burial Ground Week and Churches Count on Nature (June 8-16), everyone is invited to explore these unique places and contribute to wildlife surveys. The initiative, organized by Caring for God's Acre and supported by the Church of England, the Church of Wales, and A Rocha UK, builds upon the Church of England's commitment to promote and document biodiversity in its churchyards, as declared at the General Synod in February.

Participants can use the iNaturalist app to record the wildlife they encounter. A series of webinars will also be available.

Over the past three years, more than 1,300 events involving more than 24,500 participants have resulted in 37,355 wildlife records submitted, a testament to the vital role these spaces play in preserving and nurturing our natural heritage.

Jill Elston, Chair Designate of the EcoDiocese Group says, "It's easy to join in with the Churches Count on Nature week (8-16th June) and record some of the wildlife in your churchyard or on your church land. If you have access to a smartphone or tablet you can download the iNaturalist app and register within the app for the Beautiful Burial Ground Project. The app allows you to take photos and gives you help to identify species. It can be great fun and highly addictive once you get started! Why not invite others from your community to join you?

"Taking part in Churches Count on Nature can help you in your Eco-Church journey and supports the motion passed at General Synod in February where Bishop Graham Usher warned that the U.K. is now one of the most nature-depleted countries in the world. If you take part please share pictures and we can celebrate the wonderful bio-diversity of many of our churchyards."



These emails usually come from a gmail address. This has happened in the past, pretending to be from James, then Cait.



Quote of the Month



God in Engineering

Tunnels

Of all remarkable engineering projects, one of the greatest is surely the Channel Tunnel. This undersea railway is the longest in the world and connects Kent, England with Calais, France. It is over 31 miles (50.46 km) long and opened just over 30 years ago, in May 1994.

After six years of construction, this massive enterprise created three tunnels, running parallel to each other. Trains go through two large tunnels with a smaller service tunnel for ventilation and access. Every day, about 500 trains go through the tunnels carrying passengers, cars, lorries and coaches.

The Bible tells us of another mighty tunnelling project. King Hezekiah needed to fortify the city of Jerusalem against the invading Assyrian armies and had to protect the water supply. Using simple hand tools, and digging through solid rock, the workers completed a tunnel one third of a mile long (533 m). It still exists and tourists with torches can shuffle along the cold, wet, narrow passage from one end to the other.

Close to the tunnel an original inscription describes how the tunnel was excavated. Two teams, one starting at each end of the curving channel met in the middle. Their direction was guided by men listening to hammering sounds as they gouged through the rock.

Hezekiah's tunnel was an incredible feat of engineering, accomplished without modern machines and sophisticated technology. His vision and careful planning saved his people. (2 Kings ch. 20 v. 20) and (2 Chronicles ch 32 v 30)


At the end of his eventful life, a eulogy was written that 'King Hezekiah did what was right and what was pleasing to the Lord his God.'

We may well ask, when our time draws to a close, if such a tribute will be given to us.




In 1934 the traveller H. V. Morton wrote "I am sure that Hezekiah's

Tunnel will never become a popular sight with visitors to Palestine. It is wet, messy and dangerous, and you have to explore it at night in order not to stir up the water of the Virgin's Fountain, in which the women of Siloam wash their clothes during the daytime...

"...how astonishing it is that this tunnel of Hezekiah should exist today almost as it was 700 years before Christ. Hezekiah was king in Jerusalem when the Assyrian Sennacherib was preparing to come down like 'A wolf on the fold'. The only spring of water in those barren hills lay just outside the city walls"

So they dug a tunnel and sealed the spring.
