High Days and Holy Days

19th May – St Dunstan

Dunstan (909-988 AD) stands out as an example of what just one person can achieve when they follow the call of God on their life.

Dunstan was born near Glastonbury, of a noble family with royal and church connections; his uncle was Archbishop of Canterbury. But in 935, at the age of 26, he was accused of 'studying witchcraft and the vain poems of the pagans' – and expelled from court. He nearly married, but instead made private monastic vows and was ordained a priest by the bishop of Winchester. Dunstan felt God's call on his life and responded. That decision was to shape English history.

Not at first, however. For Dunstan began his priestly life by returning to Glastonbury and living as a hermit. He painted, embroidered and did metalwork. But when in 939 Edmund became king of Wessex, he made Dunstan abbot of Glastonbury. The monastic life of the country was all but dead; the Danish invasions and the hostility of local magnates had seen to that. Dunstan set out to change all this, and went on to restore monastic life in England, under the Rule of St Benedict.

Down the years, Dunstan saw kings come and go: Edmund, Edred, Edgar, Edward. Under King Edgar Dunstan was made bishop of Worcester in 957, bishop of London in 959, and Archbishop of Canterbury in 960. Thus was born a fruitful collaboration between King and

Archbishop which was to reform the Church in England. Monastic orders began to thrive once more. After the Norman Conquest, the days of Dunstan would be looked back on as the 'golden age'.

Dunstan taught, prayed, fasted, repaired churches, acted as judge, inspired laws of the land, and encouraged his monks in their manuscripts and prayers. He remained active to the end of his life; he preached three times on Ascension Day 988, and died two days later aged nearly 80.

They wrote of him: "he was without doubt chief of all the saints who rest at Christ Church" (Canterbury). It has been well said that the 10th century gave shape to English history, and Dunstan gave shape to the 10th century.

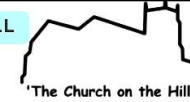


St Dunstan the metalworker tweaks the devil's nose with blacksmith's pincers.

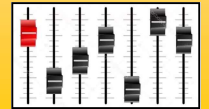

'Bell Sunday' - 12th May

If you like church bells, you will be pleased to hear that there is now an 'official' Bell Sunday - this year to be held on 12th May.

It will be held each year on the Sunday closest to 19th May. That is because 19th May is the feast day of St Dunstan, who had fun experimenting with bell-forging in the 10th century. This year, St Dunstan's day is also Pentecost (Whit Sunday) so it has been agreed to bring Bell Sunday forward by one week.

The Central Council Of Church Bellringers' spokesman, Vicki Chapman says "We hope Bell Sunday will help raise awareness of the importance of bells in our communities, and help strengthen relationships between clergy and bellringers."

The Mottram Band are hoping to have a couple of ringers on hand in the tea corner after the service (with leaflets and bell-shaped biscuits) to answer questions.



CHURCH NEWS (2)

WANT TO SUPPORT BROADBOTTOM PRIMARY SCHOOL?

WHY NOT BECOME A TRUSTEE FOR THIS SMALL CHARITY?

Two more volunteers are needed for a few hours of their time a year to enable the smooth running of Broadbottom School Trust.

Broadbottom School Trust owns the land on which Broadbottom School stands – land which was given in 1896 and 1897 by Edward Chapman of Whitegates in trust as a school for the children of the village. The Trust also has a very small amount of capital money which is invested through Chester Diocese and provides about £100 per year for the benefit of the pupils.

There is provision for four Trustees (plus the current Vicar of Mottram Church as an ex-officio Trustee), and due to changes in personnel, we currently have two vacancies. The job of the Trustees is to ensure that the land continues to be used as a school, and to oversee the bank account to ensure that the income is used properly, in order to benefit the pupils of the school. There has been a recent spate of activity to bring the Trust up-to-date; usually, the work of the Trust involves two very short meetings each year.

The Trustees have no involvement with the running of the school or the quality of education provided.

The current Trustees are Claire Bibby (Chair) and Dorothy Stringer (Secretary). 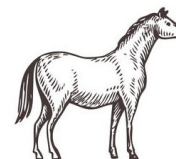

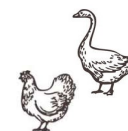

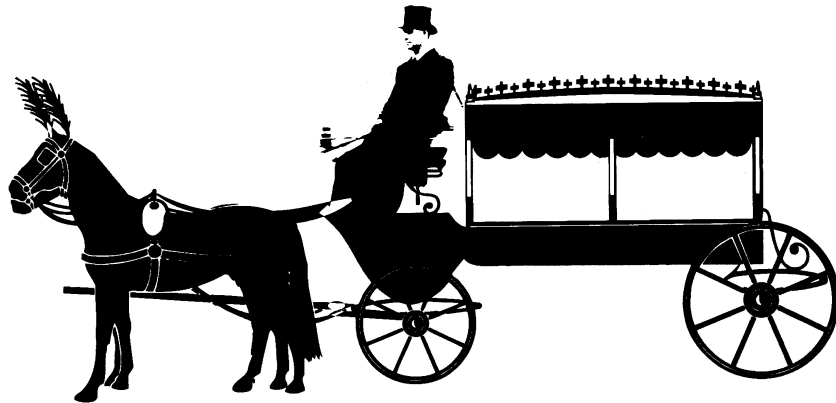
