





#### News from the C of E.

#### Share the good news, protect the persecuted: first Lambeth Call

There were no resolutions at the 2022 Lambeth Conference. Instead 650 bishops from the Anglican Communion met in Canterbury to discuss the first of a series of 'Lambeth Calls' designed to foster action by churches and Christians around the world.

The first official 'Call', urges every Christian to pray that, through their example, at least one person could come to faith in Jesus Christ every year.

It also calls for dioceses to find creative ways to revitalise churches, plant new congregations, and for every church to be "renewed by the power of the good news of Christ". The Call goes on to speak of the need for churches around the world facing persecution to be supported and protected in their witness.

The Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell, said evangelism was "one beggar telling another beggar how to get bread".

He went on: "With my whole heart, my hope for the Anglican Communion ... is that the local church... will be a place where thousands of people who do not yet know Christ – can learn about and receive Him."

He added: "Evangelism itself, the actual business of bringing people to faith, that is the work of the Holy Spirit. God is the one who brings people to faith in Christ, and it is our responsibility as the evangelising Church to participate with God in God's work."

The text of the Call quotes the German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who was martyred during the Second World War. Bonhoeffer summarised evangelism saying: "God loves human beings. God loves the world. Not an ideal human, but human beings as they are; not an ideal world, but the real world.

"God calls every person through His great love, therefore it matters that those who have never heard this good news can hear it in a way they understand, so that they can respond to it."

#### Protecting church buildings from climate change

Church House Westminster has produced guidance for churches seeking to improve their building's resilience, amid increasing climate change.

A spokesman at Church House said: "Church buildings are often solidly built and, when maintained well, have withstood the weather over the centuries. However, as the climate changes, and weather events become more extreme, they become more vulnerable. We need to protect these precious buildings from harm."

He went to say that churches "act as sanctuaries for their communities: they are often built on higher ground, so they can be a place of safety during a flood, and also can act as a cool sanctuary in a heat wave."

Church House is running two webinars in November on preparing buildings for more extreme weather, and how to use them to protect your community.



#### **High Days and Holy Days**

#### 10th October: Thomas Traherne - lover of nature

Thomas Traherne (1636 - 1674) is a good saint for anyone who loves our planet, and who wants to preserve Creation. This 17<sup>th</sup> century poet and clergyman wrote extensively about his love for nature, seeing in it a reflection of the glory of God.

Traherne was not of a literary family, his father was a shoemaker or innkeeper in Hereford, But Traherne did well at the Hereford Cathedral School and went on to Oxford. He became rector of Credenhill in 1657, and ten years later was appointed chaplain to Sir Orlando Bridgement, Lord Keeper of the Great Seal to King Charles II, at Teddington.

Throughout his years at Credenhill and Teddington, Traherne led a simple and devout life, and his friendliness drew people to him. Aside from his beloved books, he seems to have possessed very little. Instead, he poured his energy into his writings, which had an intense, mystical, metaphysical spirituality.

His first two works, although popular enough, did not win him a lasting readership. By the end of the 19th century he was almost forgotten.

A book collector came across Traherne's 'Centuries of Meditations' on a book barrow in London, attributed it to another poet but was intrigued, and preserved it. It was eventually published in 1908.

A passer-by spotted 'Commentaries of Heaven' on a smouldering rubbish heap in Lancashire, with its leather binding already alight. He beat out the flames and stowed the book in his loft. Years later it was discovered by a graduate student who happened to be insulating the loft. It is now in the British Library.

Traherne is best known for 'Centuries of Meditations', which has been described as "one of the finest prose-poems in our language."

For Traherne, we are all connected: my need is answered in answering yours, and the most prized treasures are not things that are luxurious and rare, but those that are most common, simple, and useful — water, the sun, the earth, the seed, air, the regularity of the seasons. Where this may once have sounded sentimental, it begins to sound, in our age of impending global climatic change, like a ground-gripping truth.

Be rooted in simplicity and in joy, urges Traherne, be full of passion, know yourself, enjoy the world, sustain its balance, choose happiness. 'Anchored in the love of God, open to grace, determined in faithfulness, be not a bubble', says Traherne, 'be solid'.



#### **Church News - (3)**

#### SAFEGUARDING: EVERYONE'S BUSINESS!

Our Parish Safeguarding Policy sets out how church members (and especially the PCC) can help to keep everyone safe within the church family. Anyone can be vulnerable – young or old, whatever their circumstance or ability – and people often turn to church when they are at their most vulnerable. You can find our Safeguarding Policy at:

Every year, the PCC reviews what has happened and whether our actions have been successful in preventing harm. During this year, members of the PCC have started refreshing their safeguarding training through a new online course, which anyone can access:

https://www.chester.anglican.org/support-services/safeguarding/safeguarding-7485.php

The Safeguarding Lead's report showed that the Pastoral Team, the Youth Group and Sunday School have all slowly begun to resume activity, and are mindful of the need to keep those they work with safe, and how to do that. Helpers and other employees such as the caretaker at the Magdalene Centre and the proposed Children and Families Worker are recruited using safe processes, which includes references, training and DBS (police) checks where this is appropriate.

We have a secure email account (safemottram@gmail.com), which anyone can use to report safeguarding concerns. This is checked daily by the Safeguarding Lead.

In terms of whether the policy works, we have had no serious incidents reported this year – there was a minor incident of unkindness reported, but this resolved through discussion and support. There are no safeguarding concerns in general.

The PCC approved the safeguarding report at their September meeting, and agreed that this year training would be a priority. The Parish Safeguarding Audit was last completed in 2017, so we will look at that again and make sure our procedures will still help us keep everyone safe.

If you have any concerns about safeguarding within the church, you can talk in confidence to Claire Bibby, who is the Parish Safeguarding Lead (01457 73758), or use the secure gmail account.


