

St Peter and St Paul - Feast day 29th June

St Peter (d. c. 64AD), originally called Simon, was a married fisherman from Bethsaida, near the Sea of Galilee. He met Jesus through his brother, Andrew. Jesus gave him the name of Cephas (Peter) which means rock. He was one of the three apostles who were privileged to witness the Transfiguration, the raising of the daughter of Jairus, and the Agony in the Garden.

When Peter made his famous confession of faith, that Jesus was the Christ, Jesus in turn told Peter that he would be the rock on which His Church would be built and that the 'gates of hell' would never prevail against it.

Peter played a big part in the early Church, and he is mentioned many times in the Book of Acts. It was Peter who was first told that Christianity was also for the Gentiles. Later he took a prominent part in the council at Jerusalem and went on to clash with St Paul at Antioch for hesitating about eating with Gentiles.

Early tradition says Peter was martyred at Rome. The New Testament does not tell us, but Peter being in Rome would make sense, as Peter's first epistle refers to 'Babylon', which was a derogatory term for Rome. Peter's presence in Rome is mentioned by the early church fathers Clement of Rome and Irenaeus. Tradition also tells us that Peter suffered under Nero and was crucified head-down.

St. Paul (d. c. 65) also started life with another name: Saul. The great apostle to the Gentiles was a Jew born in Tarsus and educated by Gamaliel, a respected Pharisee. So keen was Saul to defend the god of his fathers that he persecuted Christianity, and was present at the stoning of Stephen. Then on his way to persecute Christians in Damascus he was given his vision of Christ.

It was the decisive moment of Saul's life – he suddenly realised that Jesus was truly the Messiah, the Son of God, and that He was calling him to bring the Christian faith to the Gentiles. Saul was then healed of his temporary blindness, baptised in the name of Paul, and retired to Arabia for about three years of prayer and solitude, before returning to Damascus.

Paul made three great missionary journeys, encompassing Cyprus, Asia Minor, Eastern Greece, Ephesus, Macedonia and Achaia, before returning to Jerusalem. After stonings, beatings and imprisonment in Jerusalem he was sent to Rome for trial as a Roman citizen. On the way he was shipwrecked at Malta; when he finally reached Rome he was put under house-arrest for two years, during which time he wrote the four 'captivity' epistles. Later Paul may have revisited Ephesus and even have reached Spain. Tradition tells he was eventually martyred at Rome during the persecution of Nero, being beheaded (as a Roman citizen) at Tre Fontane and buried where the basilica of St Paul now stands.

Paul was not only a tireless missionary, but a great thinker. His epistles played a major part in the development of Christian theology. It is difficult to overemphasise the influence of Paul on Christian thought and history: he had a major effect on Augustine, Thomas Aquinas, Luther, Calvin and others. Both apostles were venerated from very early times both in the Liturgy and in private prayers, as testified by Greek and Latin graffiti in the catacombs of the early 3rd century.

The Coronation - an afterthought

The crowning is perhaps the most famous part of a British coronation. Yet easily overlooked – and equally important – is the coronation oath, which has been a fundamental component of the ceremony since medieval times.

It is of such significance that the remainder of the rite cannot proceed unless it has been sworn. Why? Because the oath is the essential counterpart to the recognition and acclamation.

The recognition is the moment at the beginning of the ceremony when the monarch is presented to the people for approval. The acclamation is the moment in which the people accept the new monarch.

Together, these three acts establish a contractual relationship between sovereign and peoples. By public commitment to the promises and values enshrined in the oath, the monarch is forming a bond to the largely uncodified constitution (the UK's constitution has never been assembled into a single written document).

There had been talk of a shorter service for Charles III's coronation. But to have omitted these vital stages would have amounted to constitutional vandalism.

In Anglo-Saxon times, the witan (the leading nobles or council of the country) chose the new sovereign. And until at least the middle ages, a secular enthronement preceded the coronation service.

Today's acclamation comes from that tradition of electing a sovereign. The officiant (usually the Archbishop of Canterbury), standing with the candidate in Westminster Abbey, asks whether or not the congregation recognises the candidate's entitlement to be crowned.

Afterwards, comes the oath proper. Elizabeth II swore: The things which I have here before promised, I will perform and keep. So help me God.

As this shows, the monarch swears to uphold certain key values: law, justice and mercy .That obligation speaks to the nation, but also broadcasts a global message of what the United Kingdom stands for.



Staying Safe

The holiday season is almost upon us, and with it the usual annual increase in 'Friend in need' scams.



Scammers keep changing their tactics. To help you stay ahead of them, here is an update on the 'Friend in need' scam. We'd like to invite you to share this message with friends and family members. This scam works by playing on people's emotions, and raising awareness is the best way to stop it.

How does the scam work?

You might know it as the 'Hi mum' or 'Hi dad' scam. The fraudster sends a message, often from an unknown number, pretending to be a loved one who needs urgent support. They might say they need money for a new phone or to get out of trouble – the idea is to panic the recipient into making a payment.

What's new?

These scams have been prevalent on messaging platforms, such as WhatsApp, because of the misconception that you can only receive messages from people you know.

Many messaging platforms now add a warning to messages from unknown numbers to help protect users. But scammers are wise to this, and have started sending messages in other ways, such as via text (SMS) or email, asking the person receiving the message to add their new number to WhatsApp.

Remember the advice from **Take Five To Stop Fraud**. Stop. Challenge. Protect.

STOP: Be suspicious of messages from unknown numbers.

CHALLENGE: Contact the person who appears to be sending the message in a different way to confirm that the request is genuine. You could call them or ask them for a voice note.

PROTECT: Speak to your friends and family about how they can protect themselves. Scammers deliberately target older people who have children.






The bells...the bells...






