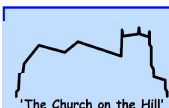

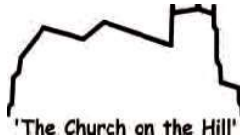

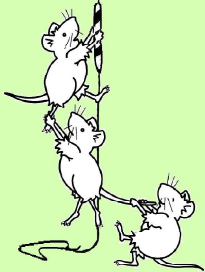

Reuben came home with some RE homework. He had to ask three different people what they believed in, why, and what had influenced their beliefs.

Why did I believe what I believe in?

I began with the Anglican party line – Scripture, Tradition, Reason. I added Experience, as a nod to

my Methodist education, but then I began to write:

'I have studied both sciences and arts and, whilst I think the sciences have a lot right, there is always room for more discovery. Science still cannot explain the soul, or spiritual connection between beings. I find it hard to believe that we are nothing but a collection of atoms. There are so many things that only the spiritual can explain.

Mostly, I believe that God is love and that we each contain a piece of God's love. I refuse to believe that the love I feel for my children is just a response to chemical reactions and synapses firing and misfiring. I have worked with people who are broken hearted, and no amount of science can explain why they would feel such pain for so long if it is just a physical response – it is illogical.

Without there being more to life there is no reason for law and no morality. Please don't get me wrong, I am not saying that those without a faith have no morality, but to say there is nothing other than the physical existence; no spiritual reason for love, no soul, for me, negates morality; what would be the point? Why would we care if someone was hurt; why care about the people who were killed by the Hamas attack at the music festival or those killed by the response? Why cry when we watch something on the TV, even to the extent of crying when watching an animated story (did anyone cry whilst watching Bambi, Watership Down or UP)?

In the book of Daniel; Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego refused to worship an idol because they would prefer to die than to live in a world where they turned their back on God. The chronicles of Narnia retell this story, with Puddleglum saying he would rather not live in a world where Aslan does not exist.

Without the love of God within us, we can excuse any behaviour we like. We can move our objective from our calling from God to love one another and focus on the minutiae of our own desires. We can march up to people and bark our own demands or accusations without concern for how that affects the rest of their day, the work they will do or the people they will be with. We can increase someone else's struggles by off-loading any frustrations or responsibility onto them, we can reject others because their image, or way of life makes us uncomfortable, we can reject understanding of others' needs, we can rationalise war and greed and destruction; but to do so requires turning our backs on the love that God has placed within us.

Sadly, sometimes turning away from love for particular others is needed, but as created beings, we need to return to God's love regularly; to check in with God and to ask what next? That's where continued prayer comes in.

For all the things that we strive for in life, love is the ultimate – to be loved by family, friends, a special person, and for some the love of God is the ultimate. Yet God's love is unconditional and does not rely on anything from us. When we strive for that love, we are striving to increase the love within us; our love for God; our desire to be more like God.

I believe because I have felt that love and I cannot explain it through chemicals and electrics of the body. For me that is faith, and my faith is characterised by the belief that God sent His only Son to live among us, to experience the human condition of love and pain and to die upon the cross, absolving our wrong thoughts and actions and bringing us closer in relationship to God.'

And you thought I would be talking about my upcoming departure from Mottram Church. Well, I firmly believe that God's love is here. I am told that vicars often try to tell churches what to look for in their next vicar. I am not going to do that. I am going to ask you to look to yourselves; to look for God's love in your lives; for the things that cannot be explained by science or money; for what matters to you, as a collective body of the church in this place; where you wish for that body to go and to be. Once you have the answer, pray to God, placing that love in your hearts and at the forefront of everything you do.

May God's love bless you.

News from the C of E

A new Christmas carol for the Church of England

The C of E is inviting choirs in churches, schools and communities to 'join the song' alongside one of the UK's leading choral composers.

The 'song' is a new interpretation of 'The First Nowell.' It has been given a brand-new melody by well-known composer Bob Chilcott and is the centrepiece of this year's Church of England Christmas focus: **Follow The Star: Join The Song.**

Bob Chilcott's pieces include *Can you hear me?*, *A Little Jazz Mass*, and the *St John Passion*. His music has been recorded by The King's Singers, The Sixteen, Tenebrae and The BBC Singers, among others.

"It's been an absolute thrill for me to be able to write new music for this famous carol and to be part of 'Follow the Star' Bob Chilcott said.

"I have aimed to make the melody easy to pick up and I hope all will enjoy singing it, at a time of year when the joy of singing is so central to worship and to the celebration of Christmas."

The carol is published by Oxford University Press and features as part of OUP's new edition of the favourite series, Carols for Choirs (6).

New Remembrance poppy introduced by the Royal British Legion.

For the first time in 28 years, there is a new kind of poppy for Remembrance Sunday - it is plastic free.

The new poppy has been three years in the development and making. The aim was to reduce the use of single-use plastic and to "be economical, sustainable, and less impactful to the environment."

The poppy is made from a blend of renewable fibres, 50% of which has been recovered from waste used in the production of coffee cups.

The plastic-free poppy will be available alongside remaining stocks of the current poppy, to reduce any waste of poppies already produced. Single-use-plastic poppies can be returned to Sainsbury's for recycling.

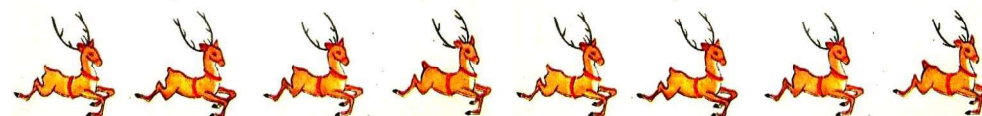

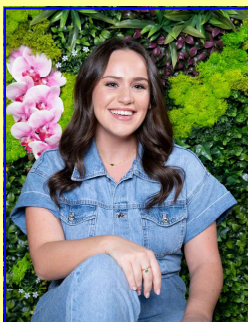
Ellie will be familiar to the many fans of ITV's 'Coronation Street' after starring as Faye Windass for 12 years.

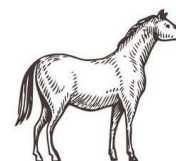

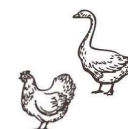

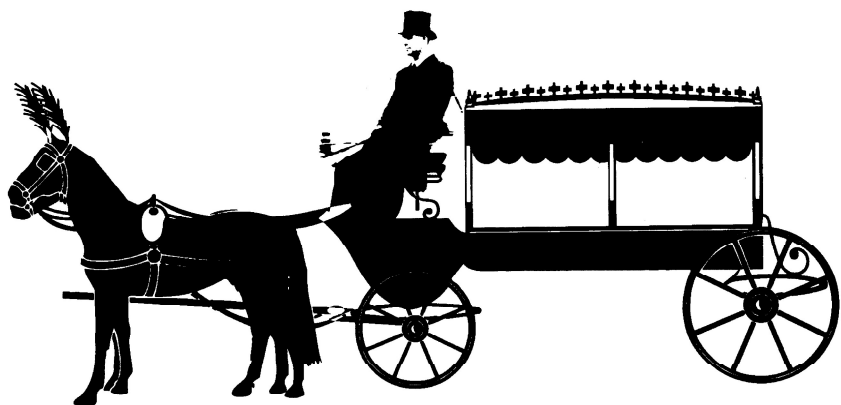
