A note to adults

Children, and others, may have different thoughts to you. The questions are designed to be as open ended as possible.

Be open to hearing something unexpected.

Which character do you feel is most like you?

What would you see if you were there?

Which character would you prefer to be?

What would you smell if you were there?

What difference will the story make to your life?

What surprises you about the story?

What stands out for you in the story?

What question would you ask one of the characters if you could?

What's your favourite part of the story?

How would you tell the story to someone else?

What might God be saying to you through the story?

What question would you ask if you were there?

What don't you understand about the story?

What would you have done if you were there?

Why do you think the story is in the Bible?

What do you think is the most important part of the story? Why?

How do you think the story fits with the big story of God?

What question would you like people to think about?

Do you know anyone that you think could benefit from hearing the story?

Do you think the story goes with any other Bible stories you know?

Where do you think the story happened?
Can you find out?

What might have happened before the story started?

Does the story make you think of another one you know?

What would you have told other people about what happened?

Do you think any character is more important than the others? Why?

What do you think happened after the story?

What would be helpful to know to help you understand the story?

Do you know where you can find the story in the Bible? Is it in the Old or New Testament?
