

IN THE CONSISTORY COURT OF THE DIOCESE OF LICHFIELD

ADDITIONAL MATTERS ORDER

This Order is made pursuant to **Section 78** of the **Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and Care of Churches Measure 2018** and **Rule 3.4** of the **Faculty Jurisdiction Rules 2015**.

This Order is made to facilitate the use of churches and/or church halls and related buildings for the provision of vaccination against Coronavirus in the light of the urgent national need for such vaccination and in the light of the mission of the Church to minister to the needs of the nation both spiritual and material.

This Order shall apply throughout the Diocese of Lichfield with effect from 8th January 2021 and shall remain in effect until 31st December 2021 subject to earlier termination or extension.

A church or church hall or related building may be used for the purpose of providing vaccinations against Coronavirus and for all related activities reasonably necessary for that purpose and permission may be given for such use without a faculty whether by lease, licence, or otherwise provided that in each case the conditions set out herein have been satisfied.

- 1) That the relevant archdeacon has been informed of and approved both (a) the terms of any such permission governing the way in which the church or hall or building is to be used and (b) any alterations to be made to the church or hall or building to facilitate such use.
- 2) That none of the alterations proposed to be made to a listed church building are such as are likely to affect the character of the church as a building of special architectural interest.
- 3) That none of the alterations proposed to be made to a listed church building are such as are likely to affect the archaeological importance of the building or any archaeological remains within the building or its curtilage.
- 4) That such use does not prevent or unduly restrict use of a church for worship.

- 5) That any physical alterations are of a temporary nature with the building in question being fully restored to its previous condition at the end of the use for vaccination purposes.
