Sports Premium

All schools receive a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil for pupils in years 1-6. Our aim is to continue to improve the quality of PE provision through the best teaching, enable all pupils to lead a healthy lifestyle, encourage our pupils to try something new, or improve current skills. By providing these opportunities we hope that they will develop a life-long love of PE and Sport and lead active lifestyles well into adulthood. We also encourage older pupils to become young leaders. We want the experiences to be positive, fun and fulfilling and we look forward to the promise that this funding will bring.

Sports Premium Allocation

The Association for Physical Education suggests that possible uses for the funding include:

- Providing high quality professional development in PE/Sport.
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games.
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/Sport.
- Providing specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE.
- New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/Sport.

At Primrose Hill C of E Primary Academy we have been running a programme of professional development in PE for teachers, whereby staff are given the opportunity to observe and team teach with our PE specialists. This year we have continued to employ a Sports Premium Lead who is sharing her expertise and passion side by side with the teachers and pupils, leading staff meetings and working with teachers to provide high quality PE lessons.

The Sports funding has enabled us to sign up to the Youth Sports Trust, which provides us with even more professional development opportunities through courses, support and expertise from specialist PE teachers. The YST also organise events across the Forest of Dean in a wide variety of sports, both competitive and with the aim of broadening children's experiences.

Funding for 2018 -2019 allowed us to continue to offer children in KS1 and KS2 a range of after school clubs that were run by our specialist P.E teacher and staff within the school. Depending on the activity, these clubs were open to all our children to develop skills that have been taught in their P.E lessons and offer new sports. The clubs were timetabled to coincide with competitions that were organised by the PE coordinator and Sports Premium Lead. In addition a range of extra curricular opportunities have been available through 'fulPHill' provision such as ultimate Frisbee, golf, wheelchair rugby and archery, and was run with the focus being on children who were reluctant to engage in sporting activities; this was fully funded and pupil premium children in Years 3/4/5/6 were able to attend.

As a result of the provision on offer, the school achieved Gold award for the third year, were shortlisted for Active Gloucestershire Physical Activity and school Sports Awards and the school entered the following competitions: Forest of Dean Cross Country championships, Sportshall athletics, Kurling, Tag Rugby, Inter-school Football matches, Girls Football, Quicksticks hockey, Forest South Netball Tournament, Primary archery competition, Boys soccer 7s, Tag rugby festival representing Gloucestershire at Twickenham Premiership Cup Final, Mountain Biking, Forest South Quadkids competition for Y3/4, Summer School Games, Tennis competition, Keysteps Gymnastics, GPJ Multi sports, , Forest of Dean Country Dancing Festival.
