## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

### First Reading – Acts 4 vv 5 - 12

The next day their rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, 'By what power or by what name did you do this?' Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, 'Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is

“the stone that was rejected by you, the builders;  
it has become the cornerstone.”

There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved.'

## **New Testament Reading – 1 John 3 vv 16 - 24**

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God’s love abide in anyone who has the world’s goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?

Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

Due to repairs to the Hall roof we are unable to use the Hall during April, however there will be a Junior Church activity in Church.

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## **UPDATE ON CHURCH HALL ROOF**

The great news is that the new roof is in place. The weather has not been in our favour, but the team worked very hard last weekend to catch the dry weather required to remove the old roof and install the new roof panels. Once the old roof was off it became clear that there was some missing material around / supporting the gutters on either side (where the water ingress has been worse) and additional work was carried out to rectify this. I was advised that this problem would not have been visible without removing the roof sheet and perhaps explains why successive attempts at relining the gutters have not been successful.

This all means that we will be cleaning over the weekend and Happytots and the other regular hirers can return to the hall on Monday - but the only access remains through the side door as the scaffolding will still be in place.

During the week of 15th April, the roof team will finish the flashing and the heavy machinery, airbags and remaining rubbish will be removed from the car park. The exception being the heras fencing which will stay as long as the scaffolding is in place. The solar panels will also be installed next week and the teams will need to be in and out of the Hawley room and small kitchen dealing with the wiring and electrics. The car part will be re-opened to church and hall users when the heavy equipment has been removed, we hope this will be towards the end of the week.

The bad news is that the gutter lining has not yet been done - due to the ongoing wet weather. This means we may continue to see leakage into the hall. The team needs 2-3 clear, dry days to remove the existing linings and replace and the weather forecast for next week is not looking helpful. At present this doesn't delay the whole project - but it might unless we have a few days (and nights) of dry weather. Please pray!
