THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Old Testament Reading – Genesis 9 vv 8 -17

Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, 'As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth.' God said, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be

a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth.’ God said to Noah, ‘This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth.’

At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

New Testament Reading – 1 Peter 3 vv 18 – 22

For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight people, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

This is the word of the Lord.

Gospel Reading – Mark 1 vv 9 – 15

Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory.

The Lord is a great God, O that today you would listen to his voice. Harden not your hearts.

All Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him.

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Stewardship - Time and Talents

Would you like to do more to support our family of St. Hilda? There are lots of opportunities requiring anything from a few minutes to many hours of your time. Training is given if required. Some of them are:

Altar Server: some extra time before and after the service on duty days.

Sunday refreshments: more extra time before and after the service on duty days.

Wednesday refreshments: 10:30am - 1pm on duty days.

Leading the intercessions: preparation time at your convenience every few weeks.

Reading a lesson in church: a few minutes preparation time. A microphone can be brought to you if you cannot get to the lectern.

Open and close the church on a week day: travel time plus a few minutes morning and early evening on duty days.

Cleaning: need ability to use a vacuum cleaner for about an hour once a week or fortnight.

Gardening: whenever you feel inclined! Tools can be provided.

Technical Support: ad hoc; to support the live stream of the Sunday morning service and updating the church web site.

Chorister: need ability to sing in tune. The ability to read music is helpful but not essential. Practice Friday evening 7 - 8ish, on duty Sunday mornings and festival services - except during August.

Treasurer: need to be numerate and computer-literate. Several hours a month mostly at times of your choosing. Needed as soon as possible, but by APCM (28th April) at the latest.

Church Warden: need to be a responsible, organised leader. Several hours a week. Needed as soon as possible, but by APCM (28th April) at the latest - Paula needs help!

Ask any member of the PCC for more details, or about other ways of helping.

And if you can do none of these, **prayer** is always needed.

Stewardship Month and Parish Giving

Stewardship Officer Janet Edmond,, of the Diocese of Leeds highlights some of the benefits seen by parishes in the Diocese, as a result of implementing the Parish Giving Scheme:

The main benefits for parishes have been:

- improved cash flow, as Gift Aid is claimed monthly, rather than quarterly or annually
- reduced administration, as Direct Debits and Gift Aid are processed centrally
- over 60% of donors have opted in to increase their giving in line with inflation each year, which helps to address the issue of so-called static giving
- donors can choose to remain anonymous to the church, but still Gift Aid their donations through the PGS. This can result in additional income for the church. One church in the Diocese has already benefitted greatly from this, due to a very generous regular gift received from an anonymous donor.

There is anecdotal evidence to suggest that having PGS in place could help solve the problem of treasurer succession planning; for example, where the current treasurer might be stepping down, due to age or circumstance, but no one is willing to take their place due to the amount of admin involved.

And a Churchwarden of a parish in the Diocese of Leeds says:

“What’s not to like about the Parish Giving Scheme? We get inflation-linked donations; we receive regular gifts from donors, whether or not they have been able to attend the service; we get Gift Aid reimbursed straight away without any extra paperwork and there are fewer bank statement entries for me to reconcile.”
