**But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream! (Amos 5:24)**

22<sup>nd</sup> April 2023 marks the 30th anniversary of the racist killing of Black teenager, Stephen Lawrence, in Eltham, southeast London.

In many respects, **Racial Justice Sunday** is one of the many legacies of Stephen Lawrence's life. As such, in marking RJS, churches are remembering a young man who in life aspired to be an architect, but whose legacy has seen him become an architect for justice, equality, dignity and unity.

This anniversary is a key moment for church and society on these islands. Stephen's killing was very much Britain's 'George Floyd moment' as it clearly revealed the ugly face of British racism, in terms not only of the hatred of those who took this young man's life but also, of the institutional variety that characterised the appalling investigation into his killing. Akin to all such tragedies, it is a moment for reflection which will enable us to assess what, if any, progress has been made since that tragedy.

We are encouraged as we go forward from this day, to **Remember, Reflect and Respond** to racial justice matters:

- **Remember** the importance of racial justice;
- **Reflect** on human diversity and thank God for it;
- **Respond** by working to end injustice, racism and ignorance through prayer and action.
