On Saturday, 25 June, in a joyful service at Southwark Cathedral, **16 Deacons** were ordained by the Bishop of Southwark, the Rt. Revd. Christopher Chessun, supported by the Area Bishops, including the Bishop of Croydon, the Rt. Revd. Dr. Rosemarie Mallett, who was consecrated on the



previous day, on the Feast of St. John the Baptist. Later that day, a seventeenth curate was licensed by Bishop Christopher on Zoom as a lay minister and will be

ordained Deacon in September this year.

A large Cathedral congregation, consisting of the families and friends of those ordained, as well as members of the parishes where they will be serving as curates, promised the Bishop that they would continually pray for them and uphold and encourage them in their ministry – **we will pray for them too.**

The new Deacons were reminded by their Retreat Leader, The Very Revd. Dr. Cynthia Briggs Kittredge, (ThD, Canon Theologian, Dean and President of the Seminary of the Southwest, USA), in her sermon, "You are to interpret to the Church the needs, concerns and hopes of the world. Victims of tyranny live without homes, without food, without dignity and love. You will remind the Church of Jesus Christ to feed, house and heal them. You will remind the Church that they need Hope, Faith and Love. And you will take on tyranny with service."
