



#### What would Jesus have done?

In everyday life we are all regularly faced with situations where we struggle to work out what to do as Christians. Life is not black and white and we are often faced with choices where there is no simple right and wrong but where we are pulled both ways. Euthanasia, mercy killing, is one of these moral dilemmas where there is no 'right' answer but there are many other questions we wrestle with every day to which neither the Bible nor the Church have simple clear answers.

If you would like to talk with some other Christians about struggles with these big questions, please think about joining a Lent Group we are sharing with St George's Oakenrod and St Clement's Spotland called 'What would Jesus have done?'. Each week in Lent we shall be looking at one of these moral dilemmas, not with a view to finding an answer, but simply to give us the opportunity to talk together about the different choices. We will not all agree but talking with others who may see things differently gives us food for thought. These will not be heavy Bible based sessions but simply conversations around the dilemma. Obviously we cannot meet face to face as we would normally do so the meetings will be on Zoom. If you are a bit uneasy about Zoom or really have no idea how to use it we can help – one of the congregation at Oakenrod has produced a very simple guide to Zoom which can be followed step by easy step and which is designed for anyone who wants to dip their toe in the water of Zoom but not drown.

The meetings will be on Wednesdays at 7p.m. and will last for about an hour.

#### From the Church Archives

The Vicar recently received a phone-call and a letter from a lady living in South Wales.

The letter included a copy of the Parish Magazine from September 1945. The sender had found the letter amongst the belongings of a friend who lived in Bacup. This friend (who died in 2017) originally moved to Bacup to live with her widowed cousin, Dorothy Semple, who died in 2009. The

connection becomes clear with the entry in this magazine:


Miss Dorothy Tilstone, of 94 Kingsland Road, was married in church to Mr. David Semple on Saturday, August 11th. The bride, whose family are well known to S. Aidan's people, was formerly a member of the G.F.S., and was prepared for Confirmation at our church. We want to assure Mr. and Mrs. Semple of our best wishes for their future happiness.

The Vicar Revd benjamin Sockett in the Parish Notes in this issue of the magazine, mentions VJ Day and the atomic bomb and there are news items about about parishioners including those serving in the forces. Miss Muriel Hitchen had excelled in the Higher Schools Certificate and obtained a scholarship to the University of Birmingham and a choirboy, Brian Bristol, had been awarded a scholarship to Heywood Grammar School – "a most promising boy, whom it is a pleasure to have with us in the Chancel. The men's Institute had just been founded and members were looking forward to a billiards match, The PCC was due to meet and discuss the new East Window:

Women's World Day of Prayer is a worldwide movement of Christian women who come together to observe a common day of prayer held on the first Friday in March each year, and who, in many countries, have a continuing relationship in prayer and service. Through Women's World Day of Prayer women are encouraged to become aware of their talents and use them in the service of the wider community

The Day of Prayer begins as dawn breaks over the islands of Tonga in the Pacific and continues across each continent until the last Services of this special day are held back in the Pacific on the islands of Samoa, circling the world in prayer for about 36 hours.
