## Pastoral Letter #23

19th August 2020

Dear Church Family,

A few weeks ago I was channel hopping on the TV and I came across 'Richard E Grant's Hotel Secrets'. I wonder if you've ever seen it. It was the first time I'd come across it, but I gather he travels around the world visiting extremely expensive and iconic hotels. In the episode I watched, he was in Tokyo at the Claska Hotel. There's something about Tokyo that I hadn't known before, and that is that there are more small dogs in Tokyo than there are small children. Fancy that! The owner of the Claska Hotel noticed that people liked to bring their dogs with them when they met their friends for coffee or lunch, so he decided to open up a dog grooming parlour in the basement of the hotel. Pets are dropped off for a shampoo and snip while their owners sip coffee! How wonderful!

That got me thinking. A hotel owner noticed the behaviour/preferences of his guests and decided to respond appropriately. I wonder if we've been noticing what the Holy Spirit has been doing during the pandemic? A popular definition of mission is to 'watch what God is doing and join in'. How has God been at work in our villages over these last six months? As the 'scattered Church', have you noticed ways in which villagers are communicating differently, behaving differently, that invite us, as Church, to respond in ways we haven't before? For example, if people are asking questions about faith and life, and prefer to engage online, should we be thinking about running an Alpha Course through Zoom in the autumn or New Year? If people feel safe gathering in smaller groups, should we be looking at offering small services this Christmas which we repeat, knowing that we won't have a large Carol service?

It would be great if you could think about how you've seen God at work in Cottenham and Rampton over these difficult months and what this might mean for us, as a church, going forward. Please let me know your thoughts. Some of the most wonderful ideas will come from you!
