ROOF REPAIR The recent work to provide a secure bond between the south aisle roof and the outside south wall of the nave has been completed satisfactorily. At the same time, some crumbling stone and wood above the nave under the existing lead was identified and replaced. However, it's inevitable that some water will still enter and drip onto the nave floor and pews from other ageing areas. Unfortunately, this situation will remain until a major project is mounted to replace some of the wood and all the lead above the nave.
