### Pastoral Letter #48

**17<sup>th</sup> February 2021 - Ash Wednesday**

Dear Church Family,

During a 'daily exercise' walk last weekend, it was lovely to see the snowdrops in the Churchyard at All Saints' Rampton. They are such a timely reminder of spring just around the corner. Apparently, over time, snowdrops have evolved to symbolise sympathy and consolation. The white of the snowdrop symbolises innocence and purity and, because it's the first flower to bloom at the end of winter and the beginning of spring, it also symbolises hope. With the impressive roll out of the vaccine, the daily reduction in numbers infected and the promise of warmer weather on the way, it really feels as if we're turning a corner, and that our hopes for an end to lockdown will soon be realised.



As you read this, Lent will have begun. As you'll have read before, the book of Daniel will be our theme for Lent this year, both in sermons preached and in a Bible Study group meeting on Fridays at 3pm. If you'd like to be part of the latter and haven't already let me know, then please get in touch and I'll send you the Zoom link. The themes for each week will be:

- Week 1: Chaps 1 & 2 – Living Distinctively
- Week 2: Chaps 3 & 4 – Living Courageously
- Week 3: Chaps 5 & 6 – Living Consistently
- Week 4: Chaps 7 & 8 – Living Trustfully
- Week 5: Chaps 9 & 10 – Living Prayerfully
- Week 6: Chaps 11 and 12 – Living Faithfully

As the church remains closed for services at the moment, and groups cannot meet in person, we plan to use the outdoor space around All Saints' Cottenham to help you engage with Lent this year. Using the various trees in the churchyard, there will be some laminated cards inviting you to stand and pause and reflect on a particular Bible verse or passage. And to represent those who we've either lost over the last year, or haven't been able to see, there will be an opportunity to take a ribbon from the bench inside the porch and tie it on to the church gate. This will be open to the whole community and advertised on social media. Why not walk to the church as part of your daily exercise and take part in one or both activities.



A huge 'well done' to our Junior Church families and their leaders for leading last week's service. They were brilliant and such a blessing to us. Hopefully they will lead again later in the year.
