CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Junior Church runs during term-time and either takes place outdoors (in good weather) or in the Church Hall. All children and young people aged 3yrs upwards are welcome. All leaders and helpers are safely recruited in line with our Safeguarding Policy. On the 2nd Sunday of each month, we have an All-Age Service where all ages worship together. For very young children there is a play area near the organ, or in the 'Children's Area' at the back of Church, with age-appropriate toys.
