COMING SOON

APCM The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will follow the 10.30am Service NEXT Sunday 30th May (approx. 11.30am). Do come and hear reports covering the last year and plans for the year ahead. It will not be a long meeting as we're still advised to keep APCMs short.

CHURCH NEWS

FIFTH SUNDAY As it's fifth Sunday next week, there will be no 8.30am service. Both congregations will join together for communion at 10.30am.

HELP NEEDED As church life starts to return to normal we need more people to volunteer for the following roles: welcoming people on the door; serving tea and coffee after the service; supporting Junior Church; leading intercessions. If you've joined the church in the last year and have received a warm welcome, why not offer to help in one of these areas? Please speak to Revd Lynda for more information. It's likely that you'll only be needed every 4-6 weeks.

NEW CHURCHWARDEN We still need to appoint a second Churchwarden. If this is something you are thinking about, please speak to either Graham or Chris Lowe, or Lynda. If you can only commit to a year, this would be very welcome.

PCC MEMBERS There are spaces on the Parochial Church Council (PCC) for more members. This is a great way to serve the church and there are only six meetings a year. Again, talk to Graham, Chris or Lynda if you want to know more. As PCC members become trustees, a DBS check will be required.

STAGE 3 CORONAVIRUS RESTRICTIONS The change in regulations state that six people or two households can meet indoors. Individuals may therefore attend services in groups of six, or larger groups where everyone present is from the same two households. Face coverings must continue to be worn. Please also continue to socially distance from those you do not live with, or are in a 'bubble' with. The best place to chat after the service is still the church path or churchyard.
