

English – For our writing this term we will be covering many different text types, using William Shakespeare's: A Midsummer Night's Dream as our stimulus. The text types to be covered include; narrative writing, information texts, book reviews

In our guided reading, we will continue to develop our E.R.I.C skills through daily sessions.

SATS – We have adapted our timetable this term to allow Year 6 a fortnightly session with Mr Hull solely dedicated to SATS preparation. This will allow us to develop our SPAG, Reading and Maths skills ready for our SATS.

Outdoor learning – We are extremely fortunate to be surrounded by an area rich for outdoor learning, from woodland, to rivers and even the local scout centre. We will be using these areas regularly to develop personal and social skills, communication, problem solving, thinking skills and teamwork.

Computing – Miss Young will be leading computing this term. We will be focusing on E-safety and towards the end of the spring term we will be looking at programming.

Science – Our focus for this term will be on forces. We will be learning to identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces and then to recognise that some mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.

Maths – This term our focus will be on fractions. We will: compare and order fractions; identify, name and write equivalent fractions; recognise mixed numbers and improper fractions and convert from one form to the other; multiply proper fractions and mixed numbers by whole numbers, supported by materials and diagrams

Throughout the year we will also be developing our number skills with regular arithmetic sessions.

Topic – For our Geography and History focus' this term we will be looking closely at the life of William Shakespeare. We will be creating a biography of his life, followed by investigating where he lived.

R.E – This term we will be asking the question – What does it mean if God is Holy and Loving? Children will be able to: Identify some different types of biblical texts; explain connections between biblical texts and Christian ideas of God, using theological terms; make clear connections between Bible texts studied about God and how Christians put these beliefs into practice; show how Christians put their beliefs about God into practice in worship; weigh up how biblical ideas about love, holiness or forgiveness relate to the issues, problems and opportunities of their own lives and the world today, developing insights of their own.
