




The class were studying the Tiger swallowtail butterfly and Austin was asked to do a scientific drawing of this amazing creature.

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
This was his first try - he drew the butterfly that was in his head. He forgot to look carefully at the picture!




He had another try!

Austin completed another drawing. This time he had added the extra detail but he had made the wings rounded again!





Mistakes are important and we can learn from them.




Specific feedback can really help us to improve.



Learning and improving takes courage and hard work.


Remember our rhyme!
