Objective	Task
We are learning to plan a newspaper report	<p><u>Recap it-</u></p> <p>What are the 5 W's?</p> <p><u>Do it!</u>-</p> <p>Throughout the next 3 days you will be planning and writing your own newspaper report.</p> <p>You may choose a subject that has happened to you during lockdown e.g. the disappearance of the missing pencil case- maybe your brother/sister hid it!</p> <p>or</p> <p>You can use your pictures as a visual stimulus you may wish to choose your own or one provided.</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around;">   </div>



What could your main headline be?

Who was involved?

When did the event take place?

How did the event take place?

Where did the incident happen?

Why?

Remember to:

- Write in third person e.g. (he, she, them, they, it) not from your own perspective.
- Past tense- You are writing about an event that has already happened.
- Use quotes- Victims, witnesses and experts may provide quotes for newspaper reports. These can be written as direct or indirect speech (Tuesday's punctuation learning).
- Rhetorical questions e.g. How much longer can this go on for?
