Make sure you answer these six questions! • Keep your sentences short and punchy. • Remember to write in paragraphs and to use sub-headings for each new topic. • You may wish to include pictures and captions. • Finally a paragraph to summarise and to conclude your newspaper report. <p>Check your spelling and facts!</p> <div data-bbox="331 1238 1257 1989" style="background-color: #e0e0e0; padding: 10px; margin-top: 20px;"> <h2 style="text-align: center; color: #006699;">Structural Features of a Newspaper Report</h2> <p>Make sure you include these structural features in your newspaper report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Headline This should be larger and bolder than the rest of the newspaper report so that it grabs the reader's attention. • First Paragraph This should clearly summarise the whole newspaper article. It should be larger and bolder than the main text of the newspaper report. • Image and Caption The image (e.g. a photograph or diagram) should be eye-catching. There should be a caption underneath to describe the image. </div>

- **Paragraphs**

The newspaper report should be organised into paragraphs to help the reader make sense of the story.

- **Sub-headings**

Short titles will tell the reader what each paragraph or section of text will be about.

- **Columns**

Newspaper reports should be written in columns.

- **Concluding Statement**

A concluding statement can sum up the story and sometimes offer an overall opinion of the story.
