

Health and Safety Precautions on School/Group Nature Reserve/Park Visits

Before the visit:

- Do a Risk Assessment (see overleaf for examples of Generic Risk Assessments and Local Review);
- Explain hazards and Code of Conduct to the participants and staff/helpers;
- Be aware of any medical conditions of the party members and how to deal with them;
- Ensure signed consent forms from parents have been returned.

To prevent infections:

- No eating or hands in mouths after activities have taken place that involved touching soil, plants etc, unless hands have been washed;
- Cuts to be covered with plasters;
- When pond-dipping, provide waterproof gloves for those with unhealed cuts;
- Best to wear gloves if doing practical conservation work such as tree planting;
- No hands near eyes.

To protect against weather conditions:

- Wear sensible shoes;
- Wear warm, waterproof clothing or sun hats and sun-cream as appropriate;
- Be prepared to postpone, shorten or adapt the visit if hazardous weather or ground conditions necessitate this.

To prevent injury:

- Take care on muddy and/or slippery surfaces;
- Beware of steep slopes and do not get too near to the edge;
- Take care around water, and preferably have a throw-line or pole with you;
- Walk sensibly along roads;
- Have adequate supervision (Adult: Child Ratios: 1:3 for under 5s; 1:5 for 5-7s and 1:8 for 8-16 year olds).

When using tools:

- Must have 'tools talk' to explain to children how to use and carry tools (e.g. carry at point of balance, do not lift above shoulder level etc.);
- Must also show the safe way to put tools on the ground (e.g. lie spades blade down so that if anyone treads on them they will not shoot up in the air and hit them!);
- Advisable to have higher supervision levels;
- Ensure children are spaced out enough so that they will not hit anyone whilst using the tools or other equipment such as sweep nets.

Poisonous plants etc.

- Children must not eat anything they find whilst at the site, including e.g. blackberries;
- Hands must be washed after visits or before food is eaten;
- If a plant or fungus is known to be poisonous or prickly/stinging etc., advise not to touch it.

Personal security:

- Stay together in groups with at least one adult;
- Groups should stay within shouting distance of each-other (a whistle may be useful);
- Be wary of strangers;
- Do not approach or touch any dogs in case they are not as friendly as they look!

In case of accidents/emergencies:

- Take First Aid Kit and ensure there are First Aiders present;
- Have a mobile phone;
- Know exact location of group to explain to emergency services if necessary (post codes are good for Sat Nav);
- Have school/centre phone number (and children's emergency contact numbers) with you.

8. Hazardous litter	ysv	<p>a <u>Area visually inspected for e.g. broken glass.</u></p> <p>b <u>Pupils warned not to touch any hazardous litter.</u></p>	M-L
