

#### Community Larder Update

We have been running a Community Larder at St Lawrence every Tuesday afternoon since 29<sup>th</sup> July for the duration of the school holidays in addition to the ongoing offering of food through the Community Shelf.

The Larder provides a different type of support to households in Long Buckby as we offer a much larger quantity and range of food including fresh, chilled and frozen items. We receive a delivery of about 300kg of food every Tuesday from FareShare, who run a national network of charitable food redistribution from across the food retail sector. The aims are to address food poverty in the community and to reduce food waste.

We have been supported and enabled by Food For Thought, which is a not for profit community organisation operating in West Northamptonshire. We have also received a grant from Long Buckby Parish Council to cover the cost of the food as well as food vouchers from other charitable groups within the local area, which we have used at supermarkets.

People pay a contribution of £5 or £10 each week which gives them a number of points to use on food items with all fresh produce being offered for free to encourage healthier eating.

The response from users has been most encouraging and last week we had over 30 households attending. We offer refreshments as we seek to create a friendly and supportive environment and the feedback from those attending has been very positive.

The Larder at St Lawrence is the only example of one being run inside a church building and we have been blessed with tremendous support from our volunteers, the vast majority of whom are from the St Lawrence Church family with some from the other churches too.

We are so grateful for this opportunity to serve our local community in such a practical way and we give thanks to God for the way in which He has blessed this activity.

We are actively considering what we should do next and ask for your prayers.

#### The Season Of Creation

s we enter the month of September, many churches will spend some time focusing on the wonders of creation, with Harvest Festivals or other types of service. For some time now, the Church of England has named the period between 1st September and 4<sup>th</sup> October as Creationtide, or the Season of Creation, where we can give thanks to God for his gift to us in creation. It was good to witness an uplifting in the recent meeting of General Synod, where further liturgical resources were discussed.

As well as giving thanks to God, this period of time provides us with an opportunity to recommit ourselves to care for all that God has made. As a Diocese, we share in the commitment of the Church of England to become net carbon zero by 2030, an ambitious target, but one that is very important, and reminds us of the fifth Mark of Mission, 'to strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth'. Maybe this is a month when you might like to think afresh about you can do to help reach the target.

I am so encouraged to hear of churches that are engaging with Eco Church and delight that



we now have some 'gold churches' amongst us. What an example they are!

Amongst the resources for Creationtide on the Church of England website, I came across this beautiful passage:

In every acorn
there is the potential for a forest;
In every apple pip
there is the potential for an orchard;
In every soul
there is the potential for your
kingdom
to be established;
full of joy and peace and love.
Lord, may your kingdom come
in us and in all your creation.

# Premier. Christian Radio

Christian broadcasting was not always allowed in this country. As late as the mid-1980s, Christians were petitioning Parliament and the broadcast regulator to allow Christian broadcasting to begin in the UK.

Finally, it happened, and in 1990 the law was changed. Five years later, in the summer of 1995, Premier Christian Radio was launched. The Christian community rallied around the station, with thousands committing to provide regular monthly support, and to make it the success that it is today.

Highlights of the past 30 years include:

1999 – launch of Premier Online, streaming Premier to the world 2006 – launch of Premier.tv, providing Christian Internet TV on demand 2009 – broadcasting nationwide begins on DAB Digital radio 2010 – Premier Gospel begins 2016 – Premier Praise begins

Nowadays, with more than 1,100,000 listeners every week, Premier is the largest Christian Media organisation in the UK, reaching people via its print, digital and radio platforms.

Premier Christian Radio is available online and nationally on DAB and on smart speakers.

The Premier Christian App is available to both iPhone and Android users, via their respective app stores.




The vestry is a mystical place, where many weird and wonderful things can be found, some obvious, some not so much.
