All Saints' Youth Club

- All Saints' Youth Club met in the Church Hall in Vicar Street and was, for a while, one of the local places in Sedgley that young people could gather and socialise.
- In the late 1950s and early 1960s, Sheila was a member of the club, that met on Friday evenings at 7.30pm. The picture shows her at a fundraising event.
- Among other activities, the youngsters took along '45' records to dance along to in the hall: eg Connie Francis, The Shadows, Cliff Richard, Elvis Presley and Buddy Holly.
- At the dance on New Years Eve 1963, Sheila sold a raffle ticket to a young man who became her husband two and a half years later.



Trips abroad with the youth club

- Trips were arranged every September to Blackpool - and from the early 1960s, also holidays to the continent.
- Ostend was the first venue; Sheila went to the beautiful resort of Finale Liguria in Italy in 1963, travelling across France and Switzerland by train.
- In this picture Sheila is seen with the group in Finale Liguria (Sheila is in the middle.)



The drama group

- The Youth Club Drama Group would perform plays annually in the Parish Hall that would always be well attended, and they also entered in the Drama Festival in Aldridge, competing against other youth clubs.
- The picture is of the last production Sheila was involved with: 'A Midsummer Night's Dream', in 1964. She's at the top in the centre, partially obscured.
- As members got older, they formed what became SECGA Theatre Group, which is still running today, based at Tettenhall College Wolverhampton.



Ladies Walk Clinic

- Sheila used to work at the old Ladies Walk Clinic in Sedgley and one of Sheila's jobs was to sell baby food and milk powder.
- The picture shows the old Ladies Walk Clinic in 2000, pictured at the time that work on the new clinic was taking place.



Ladies Walk

- Sheila worked at Ladies Walk clinic from September 1976. It was opened in the early 1960s and was a very small, single-storey building with many windows, that made it a pleasant place to work.
- The main function was a base for health visitors attached to the GP practices at Tandon, The Ridgeway and Northway Medical Centres.
- Sheila is in the centre of this photo with her work colleagues.



The choir

Sheila was a longstanding, consistent and highly valued member of **All Saints' Church Choir**; she can be seen here taking part in the annual procession from the Church Hall to Church on Palm Sunday, 25/3/2018.




The Chamber Choir
