## Green Tips

Have you visited the new Green Grams shop in Newcastle, the zero waste grocery store and cafe? Situated on Merrial Street, just up from the old Circuit Office, open Tuesday to Friday 10.00 am – 5pm and Sat 9.30 am – 5.30 pm. It sells refillable cleaning fluids, laundry detergents, shampoo and conditioner, loose tea and coffee beans, eco-friendly cleaning goods, deodorant, toothpaste, soaps, soy candles, loose sweets and treats, organic porridge oats, cereal, dried fruits, organic grains, pulses, seeds and nuts, local Staffordshire honey, herbs and spices, locally grown sustainable flowers and more. Well worth a visit and take your bottles to fill up (although they do have some you can use).

Don't forget your bees through this hot weather. As well as lots of pollen they also need water. Take a very shallow container fill it with stones and water and leave it in a prominent place for your bees to use.

Your prayers for this coming month for some of the issues facing our world today.

We give thanks for the support of big businesses for keeping the UK's net zero target. Groups representing thousands of UK businesses have called on Conservative leadership candidates to uphold the commitment to reach net zero by 2050. God, thank you that support for this policy remains high in the population and in civil society. We pray that it would be upheld and met.

We give thanks for the return of 26 royal antiquities that were looted from Benin by French soldiers in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. These treasures are now on a 'royal tour' across the country. We pray for public safety as Europe struggles with a heatwave of temperatures over 40C. The Met Office has issued a red extreme heat warning, and wildfires have raged in several countries. We pray for the spread of new variants of COVID-19 to stop. 1 in 20 people in the UK currently has the virus, which is constantly evolving. God, help scientists working to understand the virus and those in charge of public health to take the right steps. Remind us to think of those who are still vulnerable as the virus spreads.

We pray for Mali, where the military junta recently suspended UN peacekeeping operations. The junta seized power in 2020, and is struggling to rein in an Islamist insurgency that has killed thousands and displaced millions across West Africa. God, we pray for peace and stable government in Mali. Help all partners work together effectively towards peace.

As Parliament breaks for the summer recess on Thursday, we pray for MPs, Lords and ministers. Parliament will return on 5 September, on which day the new Prime Minister will be announced. God, we pray that government would function well despite the recess and the leadership election. We pray for all parliamentarians, that this time would be spent fruitfully.

We pray for more action on plastic waste, as the Great Big Plastic Count found that UK households throw away nearly 100 billion pieces of plastic each year.
