

Sad saints: following Jesus, feeling blue

Depression, dubbed "the common cold of mental health" affects at least one in five people worldwide. The charity Mind estimates that 10% of British people are depressed at any one time. And, according to the Office for National Statistics, that percentage appears to be on the rise. With symptoms ranging from decreased energy, disrupted sleep patterns, difficulty concentrating and suicidal tendencies, it can be a debilitating disorder, wreaking havoc on all areas of life, from relationships to work to physical health to spirituality.

The statistics on depression hold true even for those with deeply held religious convictions; Christians are not immune. We live in the same broken world, we have the same delicately balanced brain chemistry, and our faith in God does not exempt us from suffering. This may seem like a statement of the obvious, but there are people who feel strongly that if we trusted Jesus, we'd be joyful - end of story. Sadly, it is not that simple.

Depressed Christians may feel stigmatised and ashamed, but they are in extremely good company. The prophet Elijah, miracle maker and mouthpiece of God, reached such depths of discouragement that he wanted to die (1 Kings 19 v.4). Jeremiah cursed the day he had been born (Jeremiah 20 v.14). Many of David's psalms come from a place of deep emotional darkness. More recently, the great preachers Luther, Spurgeon and Wesley all had well documented episodes of depression. Depression can coexist with a profound relationship with God and a fruitful ministry- as paradoxical as that may seem.

While no one would choose to suffer from depression, the testimony of those who have is often that they have discovered "treasures of darkness"- beauty and strength and grace that have emerged against all the odds. Depression strips a person of any illusion of self-sufficiency, and some find that in their vulnerability they cry out to God with more intensity than they would ever have imagined.

Depression can give people an insight into suffering that can be transformed into compassion for others. Depression is a reminder of the essential fragility of the human condition, and our need to rely on God's strength and not our own. Christians get depressed. But for a Christian, nothing is wasted- God will weave gold from our straw if we just let him get his hands on it.

Taizé

Taizé is an interdenominational religious community in the Burgundy region of France which was started by Brother Roger when he bought a small church in the village, since when it has developed in size considerably. Each year Taizé is visited by tens of thousands of people from all over the world, who come to stand back from their everyday life and search for God's will in their lives. There are over 100 brothers, some in the community in France, and others in areas of extreme poverty all over the world. The lifestyle of the Brothers is very simple and visitors to Taizé fit in with the community which carries on regardless of whether there are 5 or 5000 pilgrims. There are 3 services a day for all pilgrims. These are of a simple style involving simple chants, silence and a reading, with translations so that pilgrims of all nationalities can worship together.

At the beginning of August, I went on a pilgrimage by coach with about 40 other young people from the dioceses of Durham and York to Taizé and had the most spiritually fantastic and phenomenal week. The coach journey was about 20 hours long but well worth it. Singing in church with over 3500 people of all different nationalities is a truly amazing and incomparable experience. It was also very exciting being able to talk to people from all over the world about my faith, and to learn about their faith, lives and cultures.

A week at Taizé is based on Holy Week, building up to prayers at the cross on Friday, a festival of light on Saturday evening with candles being lit and held by everyone in church, and on Sunday morning a Eucharist service.

I would very much like to welcome you to experience a taste of Taizé at a Taizé style service at 6.30pm on Sunday 18 September at St Chad's.

September Recipe - Easy Chocolate Cupcakes

INGREDIENTS

(For the Cupcakes)

150g (5oz) unsalted butter or
I use Flora Original Margarine

150g (5oz) sugar

3 medium eggs, at room
temperature

1sp vanilla extract

175g (6oz) self raising flour

25g (1oz) cocoa powder

(The Buttercream)

150g (5oz) unsalted butter at
room temperature

300g (11oz) icing sugar sifted

2tbls milk

Method

Preheat oven to 180C/160Cfan/Mark 4.

Line a 12 hole bun tin with cupcake cases.

To make the cakes, put butter and sugar into a large bowl, crack in the eggs and add the vanilla extract. Sift over the flour, cocoa powder and a pinch of salt. Beat the ingredients together using an electric hand whisk or processor and then divide mixture among the cases. Bake for 15mins. until firm and a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Cool on a wire rack.

To make the buttercream, put the butter, icing sugar and milk into a large bowl and beat until creamy, using the hand whisk. Spread over the cooled cakes and serve.

These cakes are ideal if you are having the annual coffee morning in aid of the cancer fund, or for a children's party. I also add half a glazed cherry on top.

The Way I See It: After the Riots

'The sound of violence shall be heard no longer in your land, or ruin and destruction within your borders.' So promised the prophet Isaiah 2,500 years ago. At least his words prove that violence, ruin and destruction have always been part of human experience.

Nowadays we usually encounter them only through the television screen, but in August we were sharply reminded, in the street riots in many English cities, that they are still part of modern life in what we like to think of as a civilised and liberal democracy. The sight of youths smashing shop windows, torching cars and attacking the police with stones and bottles was bad enough.

Even worse, though, was the footage of many of them, accompanied often by adults, men and women, openly looting shops and department stores. 'Free stuff!' was the message on Facebook, though of course it isn't 'free'. Someone has paid for it, but not the people who were doing the looting.

For a week or so the thin veneer of civilisation which disguises the potential evil of the human heart was stripped away. Normal standards of behaviour seemed to have been suspended and there were public calls for the Government to send in the Army, use water cannon, tear gas and rubber bullets - anything, to restore law and order to our streets. Happily, they weren't necessary. The restraint and wisdom of Asian community leaders in Birmingham - Muslim and Sikh standing side by side - after the killing of three young men from their community, sent out the message that violence is not defeated by violence.

Streets were cleaned up, but it will take a long while to heal the fear in many hearts, or repair the damage to homes, shops and businesses. What can we do? We can pray, of course - pray that Isaiah's vision may be fulfilled. But prayer must be accompanied by action. We have stood by too long while an under-educated, unemployed and largely unemployable under-class has grown up in our big cities.

There have been warning signs - the Brixton riots thirty years ago, Broadwater Farm 25 years ago, gun crimes in Birmingham, knife attacks and gang warfare in London during recent years. Envy mingled with resentment is a dangerous cocktail. Church and community leaders can do much, but they need the support of the whole of society, because a price will have to be paid and in the end we shall all have to help to foot the bill.


They have many stories to tell of how they have seen God at work in their own lives and through them in the lives of others.





Door-to-door

On a sunny Sunday afternoon, two young church members were going door to door to invite people to visit their services. She told them in no uncertain terms that she did not want to hear their message, and slammed the door in their faces.

To her surprise, however, the door did not close; in fact, it bounced back open. She tried again, really putting her back into it, and slammed it again with the same result - the door bounced back open. Convinced these rude young people were sticking their foot in her door, she reared back to give it a slam that would teach them a lesson. Just then, one of them said quietly: "Ma'am, before you do that again, you really need to move your cat."

Your choice

One beautiful Sunday morning, a priest announced to his congregation: "My good people, I have here in my hands three sermons...a £100 sermon that lasts five minutes, a £50 sermon that lasts fifteen minutes, and a £10 sermon that lasts a full hour. "Now, we'll take the collection and see which one I'll deliver."

The other side of child sponsorship – the benefits for YOU!

First and foremost, of course, child development charities exist for the benefit of the children they help who live in extreme poverty. But what about the benefit to the sponsors?

For some reason, most of us feel that we shouldn't shout about these. We feel that our giving should be purely sacrificial; if we gain anything in return then something isn't right.

Never mind that this is not what the Bible says! After all, Jesus teaches us to expect 'a good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over'. (Luke 6:37)

As one church pastor remarked after a recent visit to his partner church in El Salvador, "They are the experts—they know way more than we do—about reaching their community with limited resources and in tough circumstances. They're already grappling with the same questions that we'll have to address in the near future: How do you reach the community when you're not at the centre of your culture?"
