#### **ECO NEWS**

#### FROM A ROCHA UK

It's been another recordbreaking summer. We've had the highest ever nighttime temperatures in some parts of the UK, and the



longest stretch of days over 30 degrees C since 1973.

#### SILVER LINING

There's no doubt climate change is REAL TROUBLE changing Britain's species and landscape. Most of that change isn't at all welcome. The demise of Ash trees—with a disease known as Ash dieback—is caused by a fungus that loves the warmer and wetter conditions across northern England and faster than it would've done without the weather shift. Warmer conditions also many exotic—and invasiveovertaking our native bluebell in many areas.

butterfly and dragonfly/damselfly species are responding well to the warmth, with comma butterfly and willow emerald damselfly spreading north and west as climate zones move. Little egret, great white egret, cattle egret and black winged stilt are four recent colonists that have opted for Costa del Sussex. And this year

the colourful bee-eater has made its home at a cement works in Nottinghamshire!

What of the future?

The future is certainly bright for some species. We're very likely to see another six to eight dragonfly species, perhaps another ten bird species and five to ten new bee/wasp species arriving in the next decade

But the real trouble lies in the Scottish mountains where some Alpine plants, insect and bird species are just hanging on. As the weather has warmed, so species have retreated upwards. The Scotland. The disease is spreading far problem comes when these cool-loving species run out of mountain. So the reality is we're likely to lose many vulnerable upland species as lowland species species such as Spanish bluebell, which is advance. The next decade will be marked by ongoing rapid changes.

What can we do? Across the conservation But there is a silver lining. A number of community we'll need to redouble our efforts to ensure new species are given a home and declining species are supported for as long as possible. the opportunity to put our questions about the practicalities of being an Eco Church to our experts in a series of surgeries focussed on the five areas covered by the online Eco Church survey. Admission is free, and lunch and refreshments will be provided (donations welcome on the day).

#### .... Al Gore's new film

## "An Inconvenient Sequel: Truth to Power" (PG) was released on Friday 18th August 2017

This is a film which weaves together heart-breaking stories of climate change-induced disasters alongside news of sustainable innovations and environmental progress.

Ten years ago we watched his original film "An Inconvenient Truth" at the home of Stephen and Drina Hampson. Today Al Gore remains deeply committed to publicising the oncoming perils of climate change and, as this movie demonstrates, doing something practical about it. This film follows Gore as he travels the globe tutoring eco-activists as well as demonstrating to his global warming-denying critics that his original, dour predictions are already proving correct – Miami Beach's regular floods, Hurricane Sandy putting Manhattan's Ground Zero underwater. Footage of Barack Obama and Donald Trump's efforts conversely to address and refute the fact of climate change are equally chilling, which is ironic considering that the fifteen hottest years on record have occurred since 2001.

This new release is a summary of today's most pressing problem and will leave you concerned, yet optimistic, shocked, yet determined. With climate change acting as the forgotten factor in many of the world's conflicts (including the war in Syria) and causing increasingly worse disasters, we need to act now.

I hope when the film comes out on DVD the eco-group will be able to arrange a viewing. As they say – watch this space!
