Sarah Bateman provides IT support particularly for Sunday worship slides and publicity, while also covering for Gail when she is on holiday. Sue Billings is Just Sharing Manager, supported by staff Rosemarie Smith and Tracey Hipson.

We are very lucky to have such committed and flexible staff, who have coped admirably with the on/off nature of our activities during the pandemic. Our paid staff are also supported by a number of wonderful volunteers, whose contribution is invaluable. We always need more volunteers!

In future editions, I hope to be able to say a bit more about a few staff members and what they do, if I can twist their arms to overcome their modesty!




