Greetings on this first re-issue of our *Inspire* Magazine after a year and a half of Covid restrictions! Thank you to Chris Curtis for putting together weekly 'Keeping in Touch' during the pandemic and to all who contributed stories, pictures and poems to help us maintain contact during lockdown which will continue fortnightly.



A special thank you to Peter Davies for uploading the services on our website and to Gail Wase and Alan Curtis for the newsletter and distributing Prayers and Reflection so that we could continue to worship individually while we were not able to gather. Thank you, too, to Barbara Duffett for setting up zoom coffee mornings, and most especially to David Duffett, who has helped keep our church life together as Church Secretary throughout this time. I enjoyed leading 'Prayer in the Park' at Warners Park on the third Saturday of the month at 10am.

Now that restrictions have eased it is wonderful to be getting back to a semblance of normality in church life. We have returned to worship on Sundays with 25 – 30 people attending weekly. We try to keep people as safe as possible with voluntary mask wearing, test and trace, sanitiser and social distancing. We are now able to sing hymns and pleased that Brian is back and able to play for us. We plan to serve coffee and tea after the service upstairs on the first Sunday of the month and when we hold church meetings.

Tookey's Café has reopened and Just Sharing is selling fair trade products once again. Morning prayers have resumed. As well, different user groups are returning to the church, and some of our church groups: Tots and Carers, and Bowls Club on Monday evenings.

Our return has been gradual and careful, and now we would like to encourage all of you to consider whether you are able to come back to worship and church life again.

Having returned to worship, I realise how valuable and precious it is to have fellowship with other Christians. It has been wonderful to meet in person once again and to have fuller conversations with people to hear how they are doing and to encourage each other in the faith.
