Flower Show rules

- Exhibitors must complete an entry form stating the classes they wish to enter.
- Entry forms, together with fees must be received no later than mid day on Saturday 15th August 2020.
- Exhibitors may make more than one entry in one class, but may only take one award.
- The Committee reserve the right to refuse any entry or exhibit.
- All exhibits to be arranged and staged by 10am on Sunday 16th August. The Hall will be open from 8.00am to 10am on the day.
- No exhibits can be removed before 4.00pm and any exhibit not removed by 4.30pm will be sold in the sale of produce and the proceeds will be put towards the Fete and Flower Show funds.
- All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and have been produced in their property or been in their possession for at least 2 months prior to the show, with the exceptions of classes D,E and F.
- The Judges have the power under their discretion to withhold or reduce in value prizes when deserving.
- Classes with fewer than five entries may be limited to two prizes.
- The Judges decision is final.

Recipe page

Simple Chocolate Sponge

Ingredients

2 tbsp cocoa	For the Butter cream
3 tbsp boiling water	100g butter
8oz / 225g soft margarine	50g milk chocolate
8oz / 225g caster sugar	2 heaped tbsp cocoa
4 eggs	200g icing sugar
8oz / 225g Self-Raising flour	1 tbsp milk
2 tsp baking powder	

Method

Sponge

Pre heat oven to 180°C / 350°F or Gas 4. Grease and line 2 x 8" (20cm) sandwich tins with greaseproof paper.

Blend the cocoa and water in a mixing bowl then leave to cool slightly. Add all the remaining ingredients into the bowl and beat well until thoroughly blended. Divide the mixture evenly between the tins and level out.

Bake in the pre-heated oven for about 25 minutes or until well risen and the tops of the cakes spring back with lightly pressed with a finger. Leave to cool in the tins for a few moments then turn out onto a cooling rack and remove the greaseproof.

Butter cream

Put the chocolate in a heatproof bowl over a pan of simmering water. stir until melted. Leave to cool for 5 mins. In a small bowl beat butter until soft, add melted chocolate, sieved cocoa and milk and beat until smooth.

Use the buttercream to sandwich the cakes together.
