Wednesday 17th - Saturday 20th February: The Whole Parish

Sunday 21st – Saturday 27th February: St Andrew's Ridge and Ash Brake

To Ponder:

What would the coming of the kingdom of God look like within the parish?

For Prayer:

- That many within our parish would turn to God in repentance and with renewed belief.
- That the people living in St Andrew's Ridge and Ash Brake would be open to hear the good news.

Sunday 28th February – Saturday 6th March: Abbey Farm, Blunsdon St Andrew and Eastbury

Do not fear, for I am with you,
do not be afraid, for I am your God;
I will strengthen you, I will help you,

To Ponder:

What fears do you have that you can entrust to God?

For Prayer:

- That God would take away the fears of all in our parish
- That the people living in Abbey Farm, Blunsdon St Andrew and Eastbury would be strengthened by God's presence.
- That God would bless all pupils and staff at Bridlewood School and those who work on the building sites at Abbey Farm.
- That God would give his peace to the people who live on my street.

Sunday 7th – Saturday 13th March: Tadpole Garden Village

Jesus said “Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?”

Matthew 6 v 26-27

To Ponder:

What else can you learn about God’s love by looking at the birds?

For Prayer:

- That God would provide for all who live in our parish
- That the people living in Tadpole Garden Village would know how valuable they are to God
- That God would bless all those who work or go to school at:
 - Tadpole Farm CE Primary Academy
 - Great Western Academy
 - William Morris Primary School
 - Churchward Special Education School
 - Sainsbury’s
 - Building sites
 - Sales offices
- That God would give abundantly to the people who live on my street, especially those worrying about their income.

Sunday 14th – Saturday 20th March: Redhouse

As God’s chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience.

Colossians 3 v 12

To Ponder:

How can clothing ourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience help our neighbours?

For Prayer:

- That the qualities of compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience would flourish among those who live in our parish
- That the people living in Redhouse would experience God’s love through the kindness of others.
- That God would bless all those who work or go to school at:
 - Abbey Park secondary School
 - Red Oaks Primary School
 - Uplands Special Secondary School
 - Brimble Hill Special Primary School
 - The shops in the district centre
 - The Community centre
- That God would fill each house on my street with love and compassion.

Sunday 21st – Saturday 27th March: Oakhurst

But they shall all sit under their own vines and under their own fig trees,
and no one shall make them afraid;
for the mouth of the LORD of hosts has spoken.

Micah 4 v 4

To Ponder:

How far does having your own house (and maybe garden too) prevent you from building community with your neighbours?

For Prayer:

- That anyone in our parish who does not feel secure in their home would be able to find help and support
- That the people living in Oakhurst would know the inner peace and security which comes from God and not just from having somewhere to live.
- That God would bless all pupils and staff at Oakhurst Primary School
- That God would provide security for everyone who lives on my street.

Sunday 28th March – Saturday 3rd April: The whole parish

'Abba, Father,' Jesus said, 'everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will.'

Mark 14 v 36

To Ponder:

In what areas of our lives do we need to let God's will be done?

For Prayer:

- That we would trust God to do his will in our parish.
- That we would know where He wants us to join in.
- That all the residents of North Swindon would know the reality of God's love and power in the Easter message.
- That I would find ways to share the Easter message with those who live on my street.
