<p>Teaching and Whole School strategies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supporting great teaching • Pupil assessment and feedback • Transition support 	<p>High Quality First Teaching across the school at all levels</p> <p>High quality homework and support resources continue to be available to children and parents through google classroom to reinforce learning at school</p> <p>Continue to build in the daily use of Chromebooks and online learning to support further development of independent learning in the classroom</p> <p>Provide regular short independent learning opportunities to combat where children have become dependent on adult support at home</p> <p>Reinvigorate rewards systems to motivate learning and task completion and build resilience</p> <p>Focus on gaps in core subjects</p> <p>Address gaps in foundation subjects through Subject Knowledge Organisers and recap sessions where necessary</p> <p>Late spring/early summer assessments depending on return date and well-being of children for diagnostic purposes</p> <p>Set up virtual visits and visitors to widen experiences which may have been narrowed during time at home and use as creative writing stimulus to motivate writing further</p> <p>Create further Y6 opportunities and cement transition arrangements</p>	<p>Headteacher Monitoring</p>

	<p>Build regular and daily opportunities to improve recall of basic knowledge and skills – maths focus e.g. number bonds, timestables</p> <p>Children identified for Reading intervention Programme and First Class Number Intervention Programme</p> <p>Reconnect with support services who were wishing to work in school/observe/collect evidence e.g. Speech and Language, Learning Disability Team</p> <p>After-School Clubs reintroduced if possible within Covid constraints from April</p> <p>Tutoring for identified children by experienced teaching with tutoring experience</p>	
<p>Wider Strategies</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supporting Parents and Carers • Access to technology • Summer Holiday Clubs • Transition Y6 • Transition EYFS Sep 2021 	<p>Telephone assessments of each family to identify those requiring technology support including devices</p> <p>Consider the services of alternative providers for some Summer School style activities over the summer holidays</p> <p>Provision for FSM and families in crisis for Summer holidays</p> <p>Remote parent consultations Early Summer</p> <p>Enable treats and trips for Y6 who have missed out on many privileges and memories that are traditionally in place in their final year</p> <p>Private viewings and home visits for new starters, individual welcome books and packs and virtual tour film</p>	<p>Weekly contact has been maintained as a minimum by staff and or headteacher</p> <p>Parent guidance and communication has been regular through a weekly newsletter and emails when required</p> <p>All families offered devices and solutions to technological issues, Chromebooks issued to those who requested.</p> <p>Teachers provided with new laptops configured to work from home and school</p>
