Giving to St Luke's Church

It is really easy to make direct payments to church:

- As a donation to the work of God through our church
- In place of the weekly envelopes or a donation in the offertory plate
- To sponsor the floodlighting
- To pay a Banns, wedding or any other fee.

We can accept cash offerings for all giving, but much prefer direct payment if this is possible. There are three simple ways to do this:

PayPal

which will show a PayPal Donate Button as on the right.

If you click Donate you will be prompted to log into your PayPal account, but if you don't have one of these then simply click *Donate with a Card* and you can make the payment using any debit or credit card.
