We say sorry to God for the wrong things we think, do and say, with these, or other words:


God our Father,

The Collect

We stand in silence for a moment, and then the special prayer for the day is said, and at the end we say **Amen.**

The Liturgy of the Word

We sit down to hear a passage from the Bible. At the end the reader will say:

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

We might now stand for the Gospel reading:

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

At the end we say:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

Talk

We sit down to think about the Bible readings

The Creed


We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named.

We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high.

We believe in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.





We pray now for other people. We might say after each short prayer:

Lord, in your mercy hear our prayer.

And at the end

Merciful Father,

accept these prayers

for the sake of your Son,

our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

We stand up to share God's peace with these, or other words: God is love, and those who live in love live in God and God lives in them.

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace. We wave or shake hands with each other.

Hymn

We stay standing to sing a hymn together

The altar is prepared and bread and wine are placed on it.

With this bread that we bring we shall remember Jesus. With this wine that we bring we shall remember Jesus.

Bread for his body, wine for his blood, gifts from God to his table we bring. We shall remember Jesus.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is always right to give you thanks
God our Creator,
loving and faithful,
holy and strong.
You made us
and the whole universe,
and filled your world with life.
You sent your Son to live among us,
Jesus our Saviour, Mary's child.
He suffered on the cross;
he died to save us from our sins;
he rose in glory from the dead.

You send your Spirit to bring new life to the world, and clothe us with power from on high. And so we join the angels to celebrate and sing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Father, on the night before he died,
Jesus shared a meal with his friends.
He took the bread, and thanked you.
He broke it, and gave it to them, saying:
Take and eat; this is my body, given for you.
Do this to remember me.

A bell is rung

After the meal, Jesus took the cup of wine. He thanked you, and gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you. This is my blood, the new promise of God's unfailing love. Do this to remember me.

A bell is rung

Jesus Christ has died.

Jesus Christ has died.

Jesus Christ is risen.

Jesus Christ is risen.

Jesus Christ will come again. Jesus Christ will come again.

Father, as we bring this bread and wine, and remember his death and resurrection, send your Holy Spirit, that we who share these gifts may be fed by Christ's body and his blood.

Pour your Spirit on us that we may love one another, work for the healing of the earth, and share the good news of Jesus, as we wait for his coming in glory. For honour and praise belong to you, Father, with Jesus your Son, and the Holy Spirit: one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**



The Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done, on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

The bread is broken in two

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Giving of Communion

God's holy gifts for God's holy people. Jesus Christ is holy, Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Everyone is warmly invited to receive the bread (and wine) or a blessing. We reply **Amen.**

A hymn may be sung, or music played. We remain seated for this and pray or reflect quietly.

Prayer after Communion

Almighty God,
we thank you for feeding us
with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ.
Through him we offer you our souls and bodies
to be a living sacrifice.
Send us out in the power of your Spirit
to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.

We stand to receive this, or another, blessing


