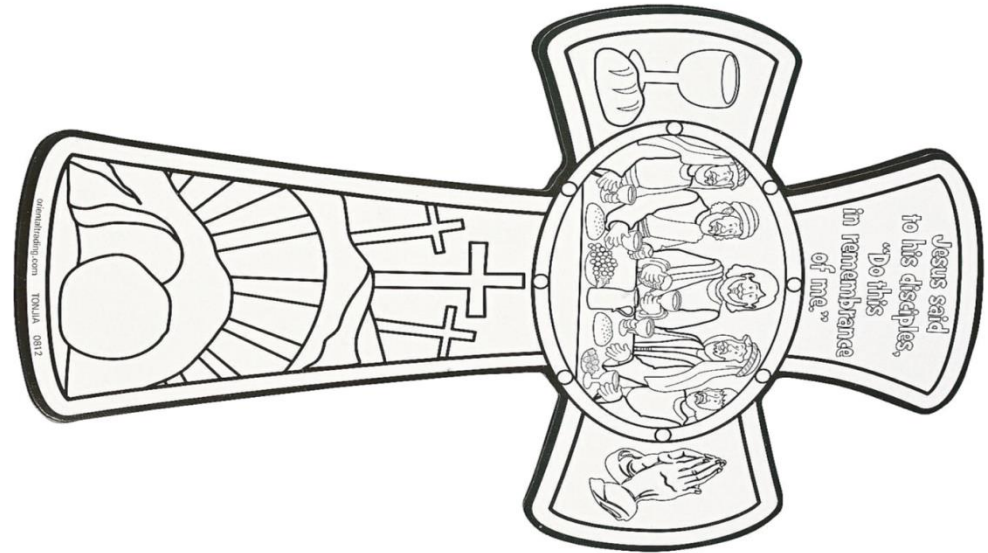


You may feel someone lay a hand on your head or your shoulder. If you are worried about that talk to the adult you come with.

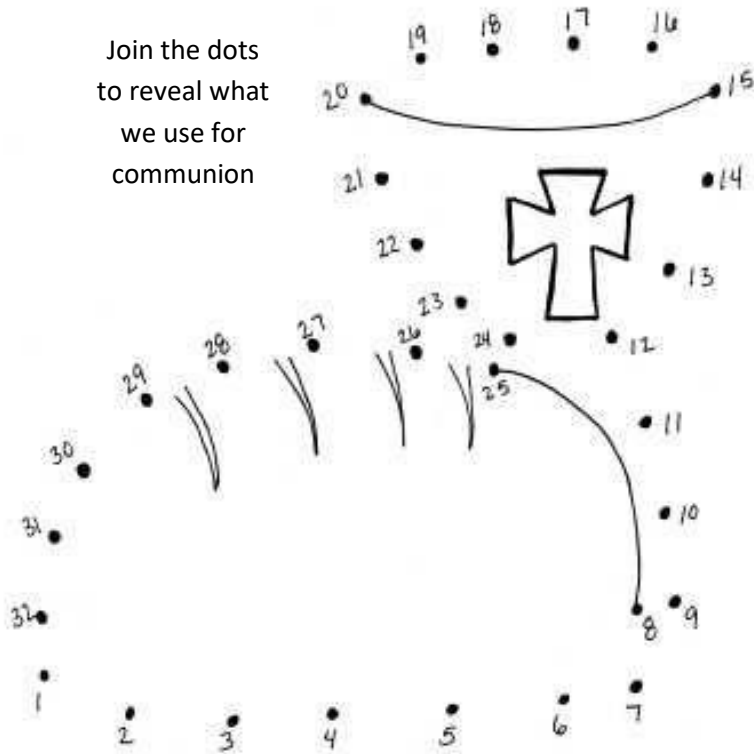

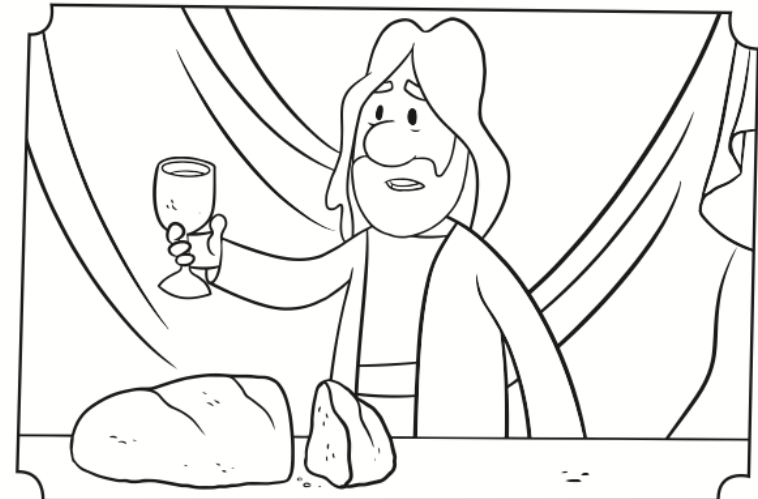

In Luke 22:19 we read the following:

And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body given for you; **do this in remembrance of me.**"
