


<p><b>Literacy</b> In English this term we will be looking in depth at a story full of emotions and we will need to use a great deal of inference! From this we will be writing a new opening chapter which tells the story leading up to the opening events. We shall also be writing diary entries linked to the text. This will lead us to look at many global issues and debates. Key skills we will be focusing on include using fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases, possessive apostrophise and using the correct punctuation.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> This term we will learning about measuring using mm, cm, m, km and converting these measurements. We will be estimating and comparing length/height of objects and looking at area and perimeter of shapes. Later in the spring term we will be learning about weight and capacity. Fractions is an area that can be a bit tricky so look out for some extra support material I will be sending home. We will be looking at recognising fractions and their value, counting in fractions, comparing and ordering and knowing where they are on a number line. We will be looking at maps and identifying different countries which have volcanoes as well as where in the world different inventors are from.
