School Curriculum

As part of the school’s development plan, we have been taking time to review the school curriculum. Over the next few newsletters we will be sharing with you what this looks like and where you can find updated information about the Uley School Curriculum.

Swimming Provision at Uley School



Swimming provision at Uley School is constantly under review, and the swimming income and expenditure is closely monitored. Each year Uley Primary School has to heavily subsidise the costs involved with swimming (the coach hire, the hire of the swimming pool and swimming instructors) due to the large shortage of contributions.

As you may well know school budgets are continually being squeezed and therefore we are having to prioritise spending more and more in order to minimise the impact on the funds necessary for educational resources to support learning.

The financial year for 2019 – 2020 is coming to an end and the governors and I are beginning to plan ahead for the next financial year. Unfortunately, subsidising swimming is not sustainable and if we do not receive the contributions to cover the cost of swimming then we will have no option than to cut back on the provision to only meet the requirements of the National Curriculum for the next academic year.

The National Curriculum states:

All schools must provide swimming instruction either in key stage 1 or key stage 2. In particular, pupils should be taught to:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

We will keep you posted on the decisions being made in respect of the swimming provision at Uley School.
