Compare using the mathematical terminology mean, median, mode and range.</p>	 <p>Write down 5 things you are thankful for in life.</p>
<p>Create your own homework inspired by the topic of the Circle of Life.</p> 			 <p>Compare the habitats of two different animals? Why is their habitat unique to their survival?</p>	<p>Can you write down the differences between Christianity and Hinduism?</p>

Can you use different lines as well including parallel and perpendicular?</p>	 <p>Write a persuasive speech for what people should do to stop climate change happening and explain factors we can all do to prevent climate change continuing. Can you create your own video inspired by 'The Perfect planet' remember to write a play script as part of your task.</p>	<p>This year the Olympics is set to happen in Tokoyo. Can you design your own olympics? Think about what sports your would include? What would your medal look like?</p>
