Create a fact-file about one.</p> <p>10 team points</p> <p>3</p>	<p>Sport and fair play </p> <p>May skipping challenge!</p> <p>Do 10 skips (in a row – no stopping! On the 1st May. Do 20 skips on the 2nd. Do 30 skips on the 3rd etc. All the way to 310 on the 31st May!</p> <p>5 team points</p>	<p>Church and community</p> <p>Interview someone who was alive during the second world war (or someone who was close to someone) about their experiences.</p> <p>15 team points </p>

What does this mean in practice? • Do you treat one another's possessions with respect? What does this mean in practice? <p>15 team points</p>	<p>Music and dance </p> <p>Research popular music during one of the world wars. Notice the themes of most of these songs.</p> <p>Write your own lyrics with the same themes. 5 team points</p> <p>Compose the accompanying music. +10 team points.</p> <p>Perform it on video. +5 team points</p> <p>Perform it in front of the class! +15 team points</p>
