Everybody's help and support to make the school production come together is hugely appreciated!


What's On

School Timings

As mentioned in the previous newsletter, by September 2023, all state-funded, mainstream schools will be expected to provide a compulsory school week of 32.5 hours / 6.5 hours a day. At Uley, our school day is currently 6 hours and 25 minutes; 5 minutes a day short. After careful consideration, from September, the **school day will finish at 3.20pm.**

Uley School Uniform

All Year:

- Red Sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
- Red polo shirt with/without logo
- Dark grey trousers, shorts, culottes, skirt or pinafore dress

- Grey, black, white or red tights/socks
- Sensible, practical and smart shoes/boots in black – no trainers or Crocs please
- Warm outdoor coat. Children should have a coat in school for break times during the whole of the Autumn and Spring terms.
- A change of clothes in case of accidents.

On warmer days:

- Red gingham dress
- Sensible summer sandals – black, red or white

Sandals

A polite reminder to ensure that the children wear sensible sandals – here are some examples. It is surprising how many trip and falls can be caused by poorly fitted sandals.



Jewellery, Hair Accessories, Make-up and Nail Varnish

- One pair of stud earrings and a watch may be worn for school. No other jewellery, including smart watches or other piercings are permitted.
- All jewellery must be removed by the child when participating in any physical education, so we encourage no jewellery at all on PE or swimming days. Please note: Teachers are not permitted to remove earrings.

- Hair bands, ribbons, bows or scrunchies should match the uniform. Hair bands should not have large flowers or other decorations attached.
- Hair that is shoulder length or longer must be tied back.
- Make up, nail varnish and artificial nails should not be worn to school. If a pupil is wearing these, they will be asked to remove them.
- No transfers or tattoos
- No crop tops - mid-drifts on display - school uniform or PE kit

Second Hand Uniform

Use of the School Field

We know how important using the school field is after school for clubs, the Uley School community and Fun Club. We would love to invite the school community to use the school field after school, 3.15 – 4pm on a Monday and Friday. Fun Club can then use the field until the end of the school day at 5.30pm.

Assessments and End of Year Reports

All the statutory tests have been completed, along with teacher assessment. This information is used to inform the end of year reports, along with attendance information. Year 6 SATS results are being released on Tuesday 11th July. End of year reports will be sent out towards the end of next week.

School Attendance and Absence

Following on from our recent governing board meeting where attendance is a standard item on the agenda, next year there will be a focus on improving school attendance. Our whole school data over time suggests that attendance is falling and it would be good to see the school data increase, but more importantly, to prevent unnecessary gaps in the children's learning from missing lessons.

Our Attendance Policy contains information about the importance of school attendance, what is authorised and unauthorised attendance, consequences of persistent absence and out of term time requests which are unauthorised. Issuing a penalty notice is a last resort for Uley School, but after discussions, it will become part of the school attendance improvement process from September. Please find a link to leaflets regarding School Attendance and Penalty Notices.

We recognise that there are times when families may need a little extra support with school attendance and as such, school can work together with families to put support in place.

Any questions on school attendance or penalty notices, please come and ask.

Authorised Absence

An absence is classified as authorised when a child has been away from school for a legitimate reason and the school has received notification from a parent or guardian. For example, if a child has been unwell, the parent writes a note or telephones the school to explain the absence.

Unauthorised Absence

Unauthorised absences are those which the school does not consider reasonable or exceptional, and for which no leave has been given. This includes:

- Parents/carers keeping children off school unnecessarily.
- Absences which have not been properly explained.
- Children who arrive at school too late to get a mark.
- Shopping, looking after other children or birthdays.
- Day trips and holidays in term time which have not been agreed.


