

In light of Covid-19, the staff and pupils have had to 'think on their feet' when it comes to worshipping together as a school and with the wider community. This year, our traditional Harvest Service was not able to go ahead so the school have created an online service to showcase all of the work completed in class linked to the Harvest topic. The youngest pupils looked at rainbows and this linked to the rainbows placed in their windows during Lock Down. The pupils learnt about the word Harvest and came up with their own Harvest Rainbow. They thoroughly enjoyed presenting in our online service.

The pupils in year two and three looked at the actual word of Harvest and identified other words that could be made using the same letters: EAT, SHARE, STARVE, HAVE and REST. They then discussed each word in relation to Harvest: the importance of sharing our Harvests with those less fortunate and how we are to be grateful for what we have.

The oldest pupils in school linked the meaning of Harvest to the parable told in the book of Isaiah. Isaiah was sent by God to give a warning to his people: they had forgotten to show the fruits of the spirit: love, kindness, gentleness, peace etc and relationships were broken. God encourages us to display these fruits at all times in our lives.
