GENEROSITY WEEK

Dear Friends,

The young boy said loudly "One for God and one for me" as he put a coin in the collection and another in his pocket – much to the embarrassment of his parents who had clearly intended both coins for the church. I don't know how much pocket money the little lad had, but he clearly felt that giving 50% of his current assets was plenty enough!

We all give various monies to various causes for various reasons, but in giving to God I believe that we give above all out of gratitude - of thanks for all that God has given to us. "All that we have and are is from you O Lord, and of your own have we given you" is what King David prayed as he and all the people gathered materials to build the Temple to worship God. Words which are paraphrased in modern church services during the offertory. It's basically not a proportion, a percentage, but a grateful recognition that our God is good and the giver of all good gifts, and we show our thanks in response.

God gave his only son - and that ultimate gift of love helps inspire our love for him; not a proportionate return but a growing responsive relationship. As we appreciate more how very much God loves us all, knows us through and through and still loves us, so we can grow in our thankfulness to him.

From Passion Sunday to Palm Sunday in April we held a special stewardship campaign called 'Generosity Week' to address the thorny issue of our parish finances. The stark truth is that our current levels of giving are inadequate to support the church's ministry and that if nothing was done we would soon be unable to meet our obligations.

I am aware that the pandemic has meant that for many months church was closed by law and this, along with many other charities who rely upon donations, has caused a very painful fall in the money we would usually receive from people's generosity.

I am also painfully aware that this could not have come at a more difficult time with the rising cost of living and soaring energy bills.

I wrote to many of you, at least to those whose name and address I have available, to ask you and everyone associated with St Luke's and Cronton Mission to do what I and our PCC have already done and prayerfully consider increasing the amount of money we currently give to God's work here in Farnworth and Cronton.

One of our Lay Readers Clare and I preached on the subjects of 'Gratitude' and 'Generosity' showing the church's need and our response as faithful followers of Christ. If you didn't receive a letter you can, if you want, let me have your name and address so that you won't feel left out! If this initiative is to be successful it is vital that we all make a response no matter how great or small our particular situation decrees.

Can I also say a huge thank you to all of you who already support the church's ministry financially and another to those who have already made a response to this initiative. If you haven't returned your response letter yet it is not too late. Please just place it in the offertory box at the back of church. These will only be seen by our Church Treasurer, Yvonne – not by me or anyone else. She will give me a summary of the responses with no personal details included when the information has been collated.



If you have not received a letter from me can I ask you to please have a look at our parish website at www.st-luke.co.uk and read about something called the Parish Giving Scheme? This is by far the best way of regularly giving whatever you can to your church.

As I am sure you will understand this is not a subject which I or any other church leader relishes, but I would be failing in my duty if I did not draw your attention to the difficult situation that we face.

I know that this is a challenge which the generous people of Farnworth and Cronton can rise to and so I remind you that God trusts us with all that he gives us, and we can say "Yes" to him in each action and moment of every day. And that especially includes in our Sunday giving!

Our Lord said,

'Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.'

St Matthew 6:19-21

If you have not made a response yet can I ask you to please pray and think carefully about what you currently give to your church to do the Lord's work and please help if you can? If you don't currently give anything to church please prayerfully consider if you might be able to give something – even a small amount would help.

I will let you know in a magazine letter in the near future what the outcome of this appeal has been.

MARY WESTBURY'S Banana & Walnut Cake RECIPE



3 medium bananas4oz soft margarine2 teacups white Self Raising flour1 cup of chopped walnuts

2 large eggs beaten 1 tea cup of sugar Half a teaspoon of salt

Mash bananas and add to the beaten eggs
Cream together the margarine and sugar
Add to banana and egg mixture
Add flour and salt to the mixture
Pour into a 2lb loaf tin, well greased and floured
Bake at 325F or Gas Mark 3 for one and a half hours
Leave the cake until the next day before cutting.

Big thanks to them once again. Here are some of the things the children have learnt about in the last few weeks. The story of the fig tree bearing good fruit and how we bear fruit in the ways we help and support others. They made a lovely tree stand to hang their fruit. They also took part in the Mothering Day service which I have been told was really lovely, they did readings, prayers, and an introduction. At the end they gave bunches of daffodils to all of the congregation. On another week the children heard the story of doubting Thomas, learning that it's ok to have doubts but that Jesus' love never falters. The activity that day amongst others was that they were shown a gift bag and were asked "would you believe me if I said a Robin was in this bag?" and similar questions to see if they doubted at all.

MOTHERS' UNION

Our leader at the April meeting was Colleen who took Compline, the last prayer of the evening. Lesley read from Revelations 14. Lesley was our speaker for the evening talking about Church Flowers. Lesley has been a flower arranger for 22yrs, and is a member of CEFA, Church of England Flower Arrangers. She said she was grateful to Bessie Lynn who introduced her to flower arranging, and also to Pat Forrester who was a great teacher and arranger. Joy Miller is a new recruit and is being taught by Lesley. There is a rota for church and there is a team of 4. They do get sponsors who give £15 - £20. In Britain as far back as the 4th century flowers have been part of worship. The Greeks, Buddists and many other religions use flowers in worship, giving back the wonderful creation God gave us. Being around flowers is very therapeutic and has helped many who suffer from depression and anxiety, nature has a way of bringing peace and calm.





Lesley has been involved in 2 flower festivals and said it has been a privilege to work at the Cathedral for 19yrs and also at the Catholic Cathedral. Lesley brought in some great photographs of different arrangements. There were 2 photos of displays at the Cathedral, flowers matching the Dean's Cope and the other reflecting tongues of fire at Pentecost. Lesley saw the Queen at the Maundy Thursday service when she came to Liverpool. Rennie Harrison, one of our late members, received Maundy money from the Queen.

CEF send a list of colours to be used during the year. For the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, purple and green will be used. We do not have flowers during Advent and Lent. White and Gold is used for Ascension Day and red and gold for Pentecost. Blue is never used as the colour is not strong enough. Lesley works very hard and there is always something to do or prepare. It takes a long time to prep the flowers. This is taking off the bottom leaves and cutting the stems at an angle so they can absorb water, this is called conditioning. Lesley buys all the flowers and knows when to get them so they are just right for the display. After each service you will see Lesley tending her flowers that always look wonderful. We are very fortunate to have Lesley and her team creating these wonderful displays. We all enjoyed Lesley's talk and there were questions from our members. Did she have a favourite flower? I think it was a hard one to answer but she does like carnations. Lesley made a beautiful arrangement that was raffled at the meeting. Barbara Kelsall's Joy said that you don't realise just how hard Lesley works. The results are always lovely so thank you Lesley.

In May Colleen started our meeting with prayers and the Hymn 'The day thou gavest, Lord is ended'. Christian Aid week was the 15-21st of May, so it was only fitting to have an up date from the Christian aid organiser. Wendy Ross-Barker is the Christian Aid organiser for Widnes. Barry Ingram was there as St Luke's Christian Aid rep. Wendy introduced Andrew Binns who is a CEFO, Church Engagement Fundraising Officer. Andrew did a talk with a slide presentation. Just Scripture links churches with those in the Global South. On the screen was James 5 1-4. A warning to the rich and oppressors. Go and weep for the miseries that will come upon them. The cries of the oppressed enter into the ears of the of the Lord. Christian Aid started just after World War 2, helping displaced refugees. They have over 70yrs experience. Over the decades they have fought famine, HIV, debt cancellation, fought for trade justice, as well as being there when disasters strike. The invasion of Ukraine has meant immediate action was needed. DEC, Disaster Emergency Committee sprang into action with 15 UK based

charities, including Christian Aid. £300 million was raised by DEC for immediate relief.

This years Christian Aid week focused on Zimbabwe, a country where the climate crisis has brought drought causing wide spread hunger as the crops fail. Christian Aid seeks to bring hope to people. Jessica Mwedzi has 6 children and has recently lost her husband. The drought makes food scarce and she struggles to feed her family. Sometimes they have to get by with a bowl of porridge each day. No child should go to bed hungry. There is no government help and they have to pay for medicines and schooling. Today Christian Aid is in partnership with Silveira House to provide training in skills like welding & leatherwork to help communities earn an income. By giving seeds that can stand the drought they can harvest crops to feed themselves and sell. Janet and Jerina were on the programme and can now earn a living. Jessica has just started on the programme. Andrew gave an interesting talk and he is enthusiastic about his work for Christian aid. He was happy to answer questions and there were a few. Colleen thanked him for coming and showing us just what our money can do to help people through a crisis and to also give them means to look after themselves and their families. He was very pleased to be asked and apparently his mother was in the MU. Colleen also thanked Wendy and Barry for their hard work. Andrew asked for our prayers as prayers are very powerful.

Lord Jesus, help us to consider the legacy we will leave behind and take action today for the sake of tomorrow. Amen.

TREASURER'S REPORT

General Fund Summary Year Ended 31st December 2021
This fund is for the general day to day expenditure of the church. Incoming resources this year were very similar to the previous year at £86,000, added to this is £9299.30 received from the Church Commissioners at the end of last year towards the 2021 Parish share. Resources expended are similar to the previous year at £114,000. This is keeping expenditure to an absolute minimum. This figure includes £26,000 outstanding to the diocese at the yearend for parish share

Summary:- Incoming £86,000 less Expended £114,000= deficit of £28,000.

Earlier this year, 2022, the PCC was informed that further credits of £33,270 have been awarded to St Luke's from the Church Commissioners. This is to cover the outstanding Parish share for 2021 of £26,000 as above, leaving £7,270 towards 2022 parish share. This is to be the last of these credits from them.

2021 Deficit £28,000 adjusted for Church Commissioners credits for 2021 year of £9,300 & £26,000 as above = Surplus of £7,300 in 2021.

Unless the Diocese reduce our parish share, we are unable to reduce expenditure anymore and have to concentrate on increasing our income to cover a similar estimated deficit of £28,000 in 2022. In April, the regular congregation and people on the electoral roll, were asked to increase their giving, but only if they could afford too. While this does help in a small way, we are asking the same people all of the time, we need to be looking for new regular givers.

You will have heard the motto "The Past is our Inheritance, the future is our Responsibility", with reference to restoration projects in the church. It is however just as relevant regarding the finance of the church too. Just like any business, if we are unable to pay our bills, the church would have to close. Not only the PCC, but the wider community too, has a duty to help look after the day to day running of the church, and to collectively work at finding new ways of increasing the income on a regular basis. As we are fast becoming a "Cashless" society, we need to encourage people to donate via other means. We already have a "Goodbox" card machine in church with a minimum

donation of £3 up to £30. Shortly we will be installing a "Digital Giving Station" courtesy of the Diocese, to promote giving from occasional visitors to the church for Baptisms and Weddings. We also have online giving from our web site and Facebook page. We all need to promote the use of this equipment and the Parish giving scheme too, instead of envelopes or loose plate. The Parish giving scheme is the only source of Income that has increased in the last few years, from £758 per month in January 2020 to £1,645 in December 2021.

We have to think of ideas to reach out to everyone to keep this fellowship strong. Everyone needs to play their part in this, not just expect the Clergy, Readers, Wardens and PCC to do it. Let them know your ideas or if you can help in any way, please get in touch.

I have been asked on numerous occasions as to what is the "Parish Share" and why do we have to pay it. Firstly I can confirm that none of this money is used for the Cathedral or St James House. It is all for clergy costs within the Widnes Deanery. This covers clergy salaries, pensions, housing, training etc at an estimated cost per clergy of £62,000.

St Luke's historically is classed as a rich parish within the Widnes Deanery, and our parish share is £84,000 per year, the difference is to help poorer parishes, have a vicar too.






